Paid Work Experience Matters

"All studies measuring this variable reported paid work experience during high school was significantly and positively related to post-secondary competitive employment (Carter et al 2012; Gold et al., 2013; Joshi et al., 2012; LoBlanco & Kleinert, 20113; Papay & Bambara, 2011; Simonsen & Neubert, 2013; Siperstein et al., 2014). In fact four of the seven studies suggested **paid work experience more than doubles the likelihood of post-secondary competitive employment outcomes** for people with disabilities." (Southward & Kyzar, 2017)

"Students who participated in work-based learning were **more likely to attend college or go to work** compared to their peers (Jobs for the Future, 2007)."

"One of the most important findings from the research shows that work experiences for youth with disabilities during high school (paid or unpaid) help them **acquire jobs at higher wages** after they graduate (Colley & Jamison, 1998)."

"In addition, research studies suggest that work-based learning may **increase school attendance**, **decrease dropout rates**, reduce school suspensions, and increase school engagement (Medrich, Calderon, & Hoachlander, 2002

Virtual Job Club – Available Statewide

June 14, 2022 - Week #1 Transition Job Club Overview:

This session introduces group members to the Virtual Job Shadow website. This session includes the following: Login in and accessing VJS accounts. Touring the site and exploring the VJS website tools and resources. Group rules and assignment completion expectations.

June 21, 2022 - Week #2: Choosing Future Employment Options:

This session will assist individuals with a better understanding of choosing future employment options. Group members will learn about the different job options available to them after they graduate from high school.

June 28, 2022 - Week #3: Career Exploration:

This session will assist individuals with a better understanding of Career Exploration. Individuals will learn about various occupations and their "fit" with your unique career preferences (e.g., the skills, interests and values you want satisfied by your career). Individuals will complete a career Interest survey and explore various career profiles.

July 5, 2022 - Week #4 Soft and Hard Skills:

This session will assist individuals with a better understanding of what soft and hard skills are. Group attendees will gain a better understanding why soft and hard skills are important to develop for success in the workplace.

July 12, 2022 - Week #5 Setting Monthly and Yearly Goals:

This session will assist individuals with a better understanding of the importance of setting monthly and yearly goals and how to keep track of their progress.

July 19, 2022 - Lesson #6 Pre-employment Activities:

This session will assist individuals with a better understanding of pre-employment activities. Pre-employment activities are the key to informed decision making. This lesson will provide group attendees with a better understanding of informational interviews, company tours, and a job shadows.

July 26, 2022 - Lesson #7 Understanding the Importance of Your Resume:

This session will assist individuals with a better understanding of why having a resume is an important step in applying for a job.

- Completing a Paid work experience project
- Completing STEM-themed modules in Virtual Job Shadow tool
- PEERS Bootcamp for social skills development
- Social activities designed to practice skills and build confidence with college life.
