To access the text-to-speech tool, students select the "Speak" icon:

Now: Assessment Coordinators can assign supports/accommodations and access test tickets <u>for high school</u> <u>students</u>

<u>All students must be assigned to a class (i.e., proctor group) in ADAM</u>. Here are directions for the <u>Quick Class Upload</u>. As enrollments change, you can identify <u>Unrostered Students</u> in order to add them to classes.

You can also <u>Update Student Supports and Accommodations</u> as well as <u>Create Additional Proctor</u> <u>Groups</u>, if needed.

Multi-State Alternate Assessment (MSAA) and MSAA Science

Locked Tests – Why and What to Do

A student's online MSAA session can become locked for a few different reasons. The most common reasons are: The Test Administrator (TA) has another open test with another student The TA did not pause or properly exit the session before closing The student's test is already in progress with another TA

Each of the above reasons are avoidable! However, in the event a student test does become locked, the TA must reach out to the MSAA Service Center to have the test unlocked. The TA must provide the student's state ID number and the reason the test became locked.

Early Stopping Rule (ESR)

Reminders for Applying the ESR

- The lack of an observable response mode is the only reason the ESR can be applied.
- The ESR cannot be applied based on a student's behavior, stamina, knowledge of the content, frustration level, or refusal to participate in the test.
- The ESR cannot be applied if the student responds to one of the first four items, if any other items are administered, or if the student provides a response in another content area.
- The ESR cannot be applied if the test status for all content areas is "Not Started."

** If a student has paper accommodation for the test, the first four questions of math or ELA must be still launched by the TA. If this step is not followed an Early Stopping Rule Misadministration will occur.

** Students without a communication response on the Student Response Check will be marked as "other" on the student response check and the TA will be asked to specify "no response was given" and provide a brief summary of the SRC attempts.

***** To check test status summary for your organization:

- Log in to the MSAA Platform: <u>www.msaaassessment.org</u>
- Select Test Status Summary from the top blue tool bar
- Use the key provided to determine which tests are not started, paused, and completed. Ensure there is a schedule and plan in place to complete all test sessions as soon as possible.

NAEP 2024 Reporting

The NAEP 2024 Mathematics and Reading results were released as the <u>Nation's Report Card</u> on January 29, 2025.

NAEP 2026

Preparation for NAEP 2026 is under way. The exact dates for the 2026 assessment window as well as additional information about the administration and notification of SAU and school selection will be provided in future issues of the Assessment Team Monthly Update.

Notable changes for future NAEP administrations:

- NAEP will begin the transition to a multi-stage adaptive assessment. Additional information is forthcoming.
- The transition to school devices will begin with the 2026 administration of the NAEP assessments.
- The NAEP 2026 Mathematics and Reading assessments have updated frameworks and new items.
- The NAEP 2028 Science assessment will be based on the updated NAEP 2028 Science Framework.
