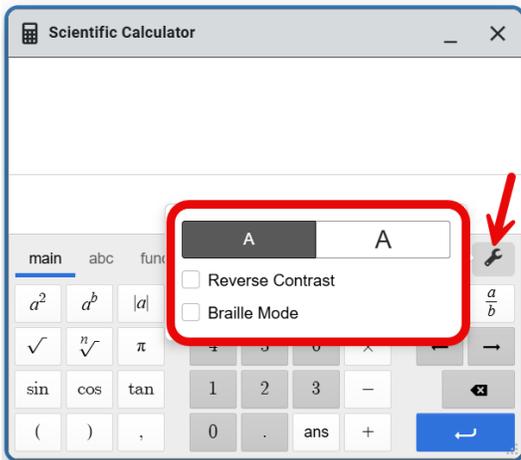
March 18: Last day to run Operational Reports for the winter administration (not including the Student Score Data File)

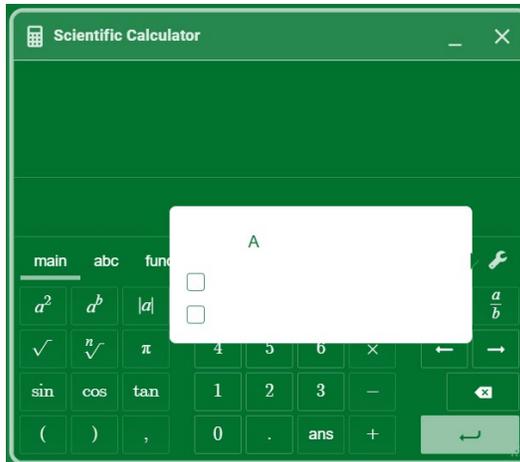
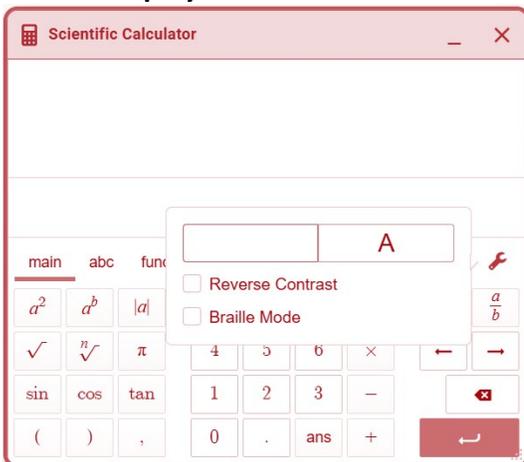
Secure Browser Calculator Display Issue

An issue has been identified in the current version of the State Solutions Secure Browser. Specifically, a display error affects the updated basic, scientific, and graphing calculators. When a non-default color scheme is selected, the calculator settings options may not display correctly, with certain options appearing to be hidden. This issue does not occur when using the default color scheme. Examples illustrating the correct appearance of the calculator settings options, as well as the current issue observed in non-default color schemes, are provided below.

Error in Display in Alternate Color Schemes



NWEA is actively working on a resolution to this issue. Please note that utilizing the *Reverse Contrast* option in an alternate color scheme is not recommended, as the alternate color scheme itself can be utilized to provide the same visual support.

New Lockdown Browser Installation for Spring 2026

This spring, the Maine Science Assessment will be transitioning from accessing the ADAM lockdown browser as a standalone app to accessing ADAM via the TestNav secure browser. There will be differences in the secure browser download process and how students launch the browser from their device. Once the student's login information has been entered, however, the navigation remains the same as within the previous ADAM lockdown browser. It is recommended that schools remove the old ADAM lockdown browser application from student devices to prevent students from attempting to access the wrong lockdown browser during the assessment administration.

More information for SAUs on installing TestNav will be available in February.

NAEP 2026

The NAEP 2026 administration window is January 26, 2026 – March 20, 2026. Scheduled assessment dates are now available in the NAEP Assessment Management System (AMS).

The scheduled assessment date for NAEP 2026 is located in the banner on the top of the school page in the NAEP AMS. Schools needing to reschedule the scheduled assessment date should reach out to Dr. Regina Lewis at regina.lewis@maine.gov as soon as possible. If there are no conflicts, please add the date to the school and SAU calendar. For weather delays and closures, please reach out to the NAEP Field Representatives directly. Their contact information is located on the school page in the NAEP AMS.

Upcoming NAEP activities:

NAEP representatives will continue to schedule and conduct Assessment Planning Meetings with principals and school coordinators.

- NAEP administration will begin on January 26, 2026. Field representatives may be delayed in responding to requests for assistance on the days they are administering assessments.
- The NAEP representative can provide guidance on completion of the NAEP Pre-assessment tasks.
- Dr Regina Lewis, Coordinator of NAEP & International Assessments is available to provide information, answer any questions, or assist with the rescheduling of the NAEP administration

For schools with students participating on school managed devices

The NAEP Application is currently available for installation. The NAEP application installer can be a district level (SAU level) person, but the person must be identified/listed for each school in the SAU for which the app is to be installed by that individual. School Technology Coordinators, and in some cases, SAU Technology Directors have been assigned to this role when no staff person has been designated to install the NAEP application on student devices.

As a reminder, the NAEP 2026 Mathematics and Reading assessments have updated frameworks and new items. Additional new items will be administered via pilot assessments during the 2026 assessment window.

For NAEP 2026 the assessment will be administered using school Wi-Fi when the assessment is administered on school devices. When NAEP devices are used the assessments will be administered using a NAEP Private Network.

Notable changes for future NAEP administration windows:

- The transition to school devices will include MacOS and iOS devices with the 2028 administration of the NAEP Mathematics and Reading Assessments.
- NAEP will begin the transition to a multi-stage adaptive assessment. Additional information is forthcoming.
- The NAEP 2028 Science assessment will be based on the updated NAEP 2028 Science Framework.

Adding Student Accommodations through Test Management

To add accommodations through Test Management, you must have “Registration-Add/Edit,” “Registration-Search/View,” “Registration-Edit Accommodations” and “Test Setup-Primary Window” permissions in WIDA AMS. These permissions are included in the District and School default permission sets.

To view or edit a student’s accommodations, complete the following steps:

1. Click **Test Management** from the WIDA AMS My Applications menu bar.
2. Confirm or enter your site criteria in the upper right corner. **Click Save**.
3. Confirm or enter your Registration Window.
4. Select the **Registered Students** tab and search for the student by name or state student ID. Any student with related search criteria will automatically filter on the screen with his or her current registrations.
5. Click the vertical ellipsis icon under the ACTION column for the student and the domain to be edited.
6. Select **Manage Accommodations** from the options provided.
7. In the Accommodations window select the checkboxes for the applicable accommodations pertaining to that domain.

Note: Not all accommodations apply to all domains, so the accommodations available to select will vary depending on the domain.

1. Click **Save** to save your changes (or click **Cancel** to cancel them.)
