## Special Consideration Exemption Requests

Maine Through Year and Maine Science Assessments



#### Timeline for <u>Submission of Special</u> <u>Consideration Exemption Requests</u>

- What is a "significant medical emergency"?
  - This includes long-term hospitalization without access to academics, severe trauma, mental health crisis (student is a danger to self or others), or placement in hospice care. A medical emergency may also include medically fragile students who are not able to participate in *any* academic activity and/or statewide assessment due to a debilitating disease.
- Deadline for initial submission of a Special Consideration exemption request:
  - May 23 for Maine Science Assessment for Grades 5 & 8
  - May 30 for the Maine Through Year Assessment
- Deadline for providing any additional medical documentation if the initial submission is considered incomplete: June 6
  - This applies to both the Maine Through Year Assessment and Maine Science Assessment for grades 5, 8, and high school



# Maine Through Year Assessment



#### **Required Spring Administration: Timeline**

March 24 – May 16: <u>Paper-based form request</u> window (standard print, large print, and braille)

**April 14 – May 30:** Administration window

**April 14 – June 6:** Acacia – MAP Growth sync is on

May 23 @ 4:00 PM: Last day to request an assessment reset

**June 2-6:** <u>SAU Data Cleanup Window</u> – *Most data cleanup tasks can be completed throughout the testing window* 

Anticipated July 7: Spring 2025 Student Score Data File CSV becomes available for each SAU

Anticipated July 14: Spring 2025 Individual Student Reports become available

July 31: Last day to run Operational Reports (except for the SSDF) for Spring 2025




#### **Memo from NWEA: Preliminary Score Results**

- Preliminary student scores are available within 72 hours of a student submitting their test session.
- NWEA can provide these preliminary results so quickly because, like MAP Growth, the Maine Through Year Assessment is pre-equated.
- Student scores on the Maine Through Year Assessment are not considered finalized until after data validation has been completed and the Student Score Data File is available in the Acacia platform.
- The data file is expected to be available on July 7, 2025; this date could change if post-equating is required.
- NWEA is confident that adjustments made to item parameters in Spring 2024 will prevent the need for post-equating, yet there remains the possibility that adjustments may need to be made.



## Navigating Text-to-Speech in the State Solutions Secure Browser



**Speak** opens the text-to-speech tool. **Audio** allows the student to adjust the volume and speed.





Read aloud ALL text



Select a specific word, sentence, or paragraph to read aloud

Provide students with an opportunity to practice using the TTS tool: <u>Item</u> <u>Type Sampler</u>.

Text-to-speech will NOT read the Reading Passages on the Reading assessment.



## Accommodations Anomalies: Human Reader for Reading Passages

- **Human Reader** *for Reading Passages* is an accommodation only allowable for students in grades 6+ with a print disability.
  - Print Disability "Human Reader for Reading Passages" Flow Chart
  - Print Disability "Human Reader for Reading Passages" Accommodation Checklist
- If a student is utilizing a **Human Reader for Reading Passages**, they MUST also be using either **Text-to-Speech** (all computer-based assessments) or **Human Reader** (paper-based assessments) for the directions, questions, and answer choices.
- **Anomaly 1:** The student is assigned Human Reader for Reading Passages but <u>not</u> assigned Text-to-Speech or Human Reader.
- Anomaly 2: The student assigned Human Reader for Reading Passages is in grades 3-5.
- The presence of either of these anomalies without resolution prior to the close of the SAU
   Data Cleanup window (June 6) may result in an invalidation of student score results.

## What are the 3 tasks that MUST be completed in the ADAM platform in order for students to assess?

- 1. Create classes (i.e., default proctor groups).
  - Recommended: Quick Class Upload
  - If you already created classes, you can <u>Identify Unrostered Students</u> and <u>Update Class</u> <u>Enrollments</u> (e.g., add new students to a class).
  - *Note*: You must create a *unique* class code not being used by any other Maine school.
- 2. Assign supports and accommodations to students, either <u>individually</u> or <u>in bulk</u>.
  - Questions about appropriate supports and accommodations? See the <u>Accessibility Guide</u>.
- 3. Print test tickets.




## What do proctors need to do to prepare for the Maine Science Assessment?

#### **Required for ALL Proctors**

- Watch Maine Educational Assessment
   Security Webisodes and sign the MEA
   Security & Data Privacy Agreement
   (Appendix A of the MEA Security Handbook)
- Watch the <u>Proctor Training Video</u> (updated link with improved audio; prior link is still accessible)
- Read the applicable sections of the <u>Assessment Administration Manual</u> (e.g., proctors of online assessments do not need to read sections regarding paper-based tests)

**Optional –** Only for proctors accessing the Proctor Dashboard at adamexam.com



## **Auto-Submission** of Sessions

- Each incomplete session will auto-submit at 11:59pm each day. This includes sessions for which the student logged in but answered no questions.
- There are a limited amount of reasons that an unsubmit may occur at a later date.
- If an unsubmit is approved, the student would be able to re-access their previous session, including all of their prior answers.




#### When should I reseat students?

- The student has exited the lockdown browser.
- The student's session has timed out due to inactivity.



- The session is breached.
- The session appears as "In Progress" in the proctor dashboard but the student is not logged in.
- The Test Status is "Needs Attention".





#### **Navigating Text-to-Speech in the ADAM Lockdown Browser**

**Provide students with an opportunity to practice using the TTS tool: Practice Tests.** 



*Note:* The text-to-speech tool in ADAM will read alt text for images and other graphics, such as charts and diagrams.

The student may skip the reading of alt text by using the **u** icon to select anywhere in the text to start reading aloud.

Students can adjust the speed under Settings .


## Preparing for NAEP 2026 – Understanding the Context




- New <u>frameworks</u> for the NAEP <u>mathematics</u> and <u>reading</u> assessments
- Continue the transition to administer NAEP on school devices.
  - Students at schools using <u>school managed</u> Chromebooks or Windows devices that meet the technical requirements will be assessed using school devices and school Wi-Fi for 2026.
  - Other schools will be assessed on NAEP devices using a NAEP provide private network
  - Goal is to include iOS devices for NAEP 2028
- Transitions at the U.S. Dept. of Education and NCES may result in communication delays.
- SAU and school notifications are tentatively scheduled for June 2025.
- Additional information will be forthcoming.
