Fall 2025 Administration: Important Dates

November 14: Last day to run Operational Reports for the fall administration (not including the Student Score Data File)

December 3: Fall 2025 Student Score Data File becomes available

Optional Winter 2026 Administration: Important Dates

December 15: Acacia opens for pre-administration activities, such as assigning supports/accommodations and creating Online Testing and Reporting groups

January 5 – February 13, 2026: Winter administration window

February 23-27: SAU data cleanup

March 18: Last day to run Operational Reports for the winter administration (not including the Student Score Data File)

March 25: Winter 2026 Student Score Data File becomes available

Frequently Asked Questions

How do I interpret the fall-to-spring RIT score growth percentile ranges in MAP Growth reports?

Valuable MAP Growth reports that integrate Maine Through Year Assessment RIT score data, such as the Class, School, and District Profile reports, contain Growth Median and Distribution displays. An example is shown below.



It is not immediately evident from the display, however, what degree of growth each of the percentile ranges represents. The tables on the next page provide detailed information on the RIT score changes from fall-to-spring that correspond with each percentile range, based on the 2025 RIT score norms.

The new norms reflect decreased within-year growth for Reading.

In Math, increased within-year growth can be attributed, in part, to the implementation of the new Enhanced Item Selection Algorithm. The Enhanced Item Selection Algorithm prioritizes on-grade questions when adapting to students' responses, allowing greater measurement sensitivity from fall-to-spring that better reflects students' gains in grade-level knowledge, skills, and abilities. The impacts for the Math assessment include generally lower achievement (i.e., lower RIT scores) in the fall and increased RIT score growth fall-to-spring. This new algorithm was gradually rolled out to various NWEA partners, with all partners nationwide implementing the new algorithm for both MAP Growth and State Solutions assessments by fall 2025.

What is the relationship between a students' RIT score percentile and their achievement level (i.e., Well Below, Below, At, and Above State Expectations) in the spring?

There is no one-to-one correspondence between RIT scores and Maine scale scores, which determine a student's achievement level of Well Below, Below, At, and Above State Expectations. The questions on the assessment that generate the student's Maine scale score in the spring are a subset of the questions that determine a student's RIT score in the spring.

There is a correlation, however, between RIT score percentile bands and whether a student met state expectations (i.e., achieved at the At or Above State Expectations). Below are tables that indicate the likelihood that a student in each RIT percentile band met state expectations in spring 2025, based on the 2020 norms utilized at the time.

With the change to the 2025 norms in the 2025-26 school year, slight shifts may be observed in spring 2026. For example, given that the 60th percentile for achievement in the 2025 norms represents a lower RIT score than in the 2020 norms, we may see shifts from *all* students in the High Average RIT percentile range meeting state expectations to *most* students in the High Average RIT percentile range meeting state expectations. Maine DOE will continue to monitor the relationship between RIT score percentile ranges and meeting state expectations in spring 2026.

National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP)

The NAEP 2026 administration window is January 26, 2026 – March 20, 2026. Scheduled assessment dates are now available in the NAEP Assessment Management System (AMS).

Please return to the AMS and check the banner on the top of the school page to view the assigned date. Schools needing to reschedule the scheduled assessment date should reach out to Dr. Regina Lewis at regina.lewis@maine.gov as soon as possible. If there are no conflicts, please add the date to the school and SAU calendar.

- **Priority activities for November. Principals or school coordinators should answer the three questions below located on the grade information tile. If a school coordinator has not been designated by November 13th, the principal will be assigned as the school coordinator until another person is designated. If the principal wishes to serve in this role, no action is required.
- 1. How many students are enrolled in grade 4?
- 2. When does winter break begin in December?
- 3. When does winter break end in January?

Upcoming December NAEP activities:

In early December, **a**n assigned NAEP representative responsible for administering the assessment will contact the designated NAEP school coordinator to introduce themselves and coordinate the scheduling of an Assessment Planning Meeting. If a school coordinator has not been designated the principal will be contacted.

The NAEP representative can review how to complete the NAEP planning tasks outlined below upon request.

- Review the student sample and identify students who cannot take the assessment. Provide or update any demographic information that is missing or inaccurate.
- Provide information about students with disabilities (SD) and English learners (EL) to assist
 NAEP representatives with assigning the appropriate testing accommodations. Please note
 that school staff may need to assist with certain accommodations (e.g., cueing to stay on task,
 scribing).
- Notify parents/guardians that their children were selected for the assessment. The
 parent/guardian notification letter and translations will be available on the <u>National and</u>
 <u>International Assessments webpage</u> for you to download and print. *Please notify the parents*of selected students a minimum of one week prior to the scheduled assessment date.
- Identify and provide email addresses for the teachers of sampled students so they can access and complete the teacher questionnaire.
- Schedule the assessment sessions and reserve space at your school.
- Provide technical logistics to ensure school devices are ready for the assessment day. Schools
 participating in NAEP 2026 with school devices may invite a technology coordinator to register
 for the AMS to assist with technology related tasks.

Participate in the Assessment Planning Meeting with your assigned NAEP representative.
 During this virtual meeting, school coordinators will be asked to review and confirm assessment details and information reflected within the AMS.

NAEP has assigned a small amount of schools to the NAEP device administration model to check for performance differences based on whether students take the assessment on their own devices or NAEP devices.

The NAEP Application is currently available for installation. The NAEP application installer can be a district level (SAU level) person, but the person must be identified/listed for each school in the SAU for which the app is to be installed by that individual. This person can be identified by the SAU through a streamlined process that eliminates having to list the person on each school's page in the AMS.

As a reminder, the NAEP 2026 Mathematics and Reading assessments have updated frameworks and new items. Additional new items will be administered via pilot assessments during the 2026 assessment window.

For NAEP 2026 the assessment will be administered using school Wi-Fi when the assessment is administered on school devices. When NAEP devices are used the assessments will be administered using a NAEP Private Network.

Notable changes for future NAEP administration windows:

- The transition to school devices will include MacOS and iOS devices with the 2028 administration of the NAEP Mathematics and Reading Assessments.
- NAEP will begin the transition to a multi-stage adaptive assessment. Additional information is forthcoming.
- The NAEP 2028 Science assessment will be based on the updated NAEP 2028 Science Framework.
