Fall 2024 Administration

The Fall 2024 Through Year Assessment administration window is September 16 through October 25.

Students must be enrolled in Synergy in order to be reflected in the school's roster in Acacia. It is the responsibility of the SAU/school to ensure that students are enrolled in Synergy before the first day of the local administration schedule. The local administration schedule can occur at any time within the six-week state administration window, although it is strongly recommended to reserve the last week of the state window for make-up sessions.

Letter for Parents/Guardians

As requested, a <u>letter for parents/guardians about the Maine Through Year Assessment</u> is now available.

Updating of Chosen/Preferred Student Names

To update a student's chosen name in Acacia, please reach out to NWEA Partner Support at (855) 430-1777. To appear on the student's test tickets and within the secure lockdown browser, a student's chosen name must be updated before the student logs into the assessment. Students' chosen names will also appear on student results reports.

Assessment Resets

Please see the <u>Assessment Reset Process Flow</u> for a list of acceptable criteria for an assessment reset as well as for the link to the request form. Please note that reset requests must be submitted by 4:00 PM on October 18. No reset requests will be accepted during the last week of the administration window.

Reporting Groups

In order for those with the Instructor role in MAP Growth to be able to see students' score results in Acacia, Instructors must be assigned to students within a Reporting Group in Acacia. Reporting Groups must be created by the end of the administration window. For more information on creating groups, please see Part 7 of the <u>User and Student Management Guide</u>.

A trick for quickly and easily identifying students who have not yet been assigned to a Reporting Group is to generate a Testing Status Report from Operational Reports in Acacia. Column AO includes the student's assigned Reporting Groups; if the field is empty, it indicates the student has not yet been assigned to a Reporting Group. Multilingual Learner Exemption Guidance

Newly arrived multilingual learners may be exempt from the reading assessment (only) if:

1) they have a US School Entry Date in Synergy within 12 months of the last day of the administration window, and

2) they have an ML Start Date in Synergy.

The ML Exemption Guidance document provides exact US School Entry Date ranges for exemption from different administrations of the Maine Through Year Assessment.

SAU Data Cleanup Checklist

SAU Data Cleanup activities take place throughout the assessment administration window till November 1.

Preparation of Assessment Coordinators

Assessment Security Training

Assessment Coordinators must watch the assessment security <u>training video</u> and review the Assessment Security Handbook before signing the MEA Assessment Security & Data Privacy Agreement, Appendix A in the Assessment Security Handbook.

Maine Through Year Assessment: Assessment Coordinator Training

The training module must be completed by the District and School Assessment Coordinators prior to the local administration of the fall assessment; after successful completion of the module, coordinators will download a certificate of completion to keep on file. District and School Assessment Coordinators can request access to the training module by utilizing this form.

Preparation of Proctors

Assessment Security Training

Proctors are required to watch two assessment security trainings once per academic year:

MEA Assessment Security & Data Privacy Agreement

Proctors are required to sign the MEA Assessment Security & Data Privacy Agreement once per academic year. The agreement is found in Appendix A of the Assessment Security Handbook.

Maine Through Year Assessment Proctor Training Video

Proctors of the Maine Through Year Assessment are required to watch the <u>Maine Through Year Assessment</u> <u>Proctor Training Video</u> (9 minutes) once per academic year.

Looking Ahead to Spring 2025

Administration Schedule: The high school administration window has been moved earlier in April to avoid an overlap with AP exams.

High School: April 2-17, 2025Grades 5 and 8: May 12-23, 2025

Changes to the Administration

- ALL Grade Levels: Removal of Session 4 (Student Questionnaire)
- High School ONLY: Sessions 1, 2, and 3 reduced from 60 minutes each to 50 minutes each
 - There will be no change in the number of questions.
 - Data from previous administrations reflect that nearly all high school students without extended time complete each session within 50 minutes.

The Guidance for IEP Teams on Participation Decisions for Maine's Alternate Assessments based on Alternate Academic Achievement Standards (AA-AAAS) <u>Participation Guidance for IEP Teams</u> has been recently updated. This document is intended to outline steps to guide Individualized Education Program (IEP) Teams to determine whether an alternate assessment is the most appropriate assessment for an individual student. These steps include:(a) reviewing student records and important information across multiple school years and settings (e.g., school, home, community), and (b) determining whether the student fits all criteria for participating in alternate assessments, as outlined in the document. Students deemed eligible will participate in an alternate assessment in all content areas. NAEP 2024 Reporting

The NAEP 2024 results release will be delayed At this time, The NAEP 2024 results are tentatively scheduled to be released in early February 2025 due to the additional analyses required by the transition to school Wi-Fi. Analyses of the new eNAEP assessment platform as well as the comparison of the administration of NAEP 2024 on Chromebooks with the administration of the assessment on Microsoft Surface Pro tablets used in the previous computer-based administrations of NAEP will also be conducted.

Why is the National Center of Education Statistics modernizing NAEP?

NCES has continuously made enhancements to the NAEP program since it began in 1969, focusing on efficiency, improving participant experiences, and ensuring the assessments reflect how and what students are learning. NCES is currently implementing modernizations that allow for more flexible and authentic assessment experiences. The goal is to have a flexible model for assessing students online, in any environment, and on familiar devices. Such advancements will ultimately allow NCES to assess students in a variety of settings or locations, including remotely as needed.

What modernizations are planned for NAEP in 2025 and 2026?

NCES will continue the progress toward administering NAEP using school Internet and on devices (e.g., desktops, laptops, or tablets with keyboards) that students are familiar with. By using familiar devices, students will be able to participate in NAEP in ways that are more authentic to their learning experiences in and out of the classroom. In 2025, NAEP will conduct a field test to help refine processes, protocols, and system enhancements for future assessments.

Notable changes for future NAEP administrations:

- The transition to school devices will begin with the 2026 administration of the NAEP assessments. Schools with Windows and/or Chrome based devices will administer the NAEP in a similar manner as other state assessments.
- The NAEP 2026 Mathematics and Reading assessments have updated frameworks and new items.
- The NAEP 2028 Science assessment will be based on the updated NAEP 2028 Science Framework.
