

Fall Administration: Important Dates

Within 72 hours of assessing: Student results reports become available in Acacia (Reports Interpretive Guide)

- Schools must roster students in the MAP Growth platform in order to have Maine Through Year Assessment RIT scores integrated into MAP Growth reports.

Fall 2025 Reset Process Flow

October 23 @ 7:59 PM: Last assessment roster daily change file is generated. Any changes to student enrollments in Synergy after this time will not appear in Acacia.

October 31: Last day of SAU data cleanup window

November 14: Last day to run Operational Reports for the fall administration (not including the Student Score Data File)

December 3: Fall 2025 Student Score Data File becomes available




Reminder About Timing of the Daily Change Assessment Roster File

- A daily change file is automatically generated at 7:59 PM each weekday evening and contains all changes in Synergy since the previous daily change file.
- A member of the Assessment Team manually uploads the daily change file the next weekday morning, excluding state holidays, into the Acacia platform.
- Due to the manual nature of the upload process, **please wait until 9:00 AM** before verifying that students' enrollment updates in Synergy from the previous weekday are reflected in Acacia.



FAQ: A student is no longer at my school, but they still appear on my assessment roster in Acacia. What should I do?

Check to see if the student has an Enrollment End Date in the NEO assessment roster. If they do, you are all set, and no action needs to be taken.



If the student does *not* have an Enrollment End Date in NEO, this indicates that the student has not yet been exited from Synergy.

Math Reference Sheet

- A universal tool provided to all students
- Available within the assessment platform and also <u>can be printed</u> for students
- Some iPads using older versions of iOS are having errors displaying the Math Reference Sheet when the student is using a color scheme with a yellow or black background.
- NWEA has proposed the solutions of either using the default or white-background color scheme or providing a <u>printed copy of the</u> <u>Math Reference Sheet</u> to students. It is recommended that, after the administration window, older versions of iOS be updated.

Updating Student Chosen Names in Acacia

- Student names will initially appear in Acacia as they appear in Synergy.
- Schools may request to have a student's chosen name in Acacia updated by calling NWEA Partner Support at 855-430-1777.
 - When calling Partner Support, please be sure to clearly indicate that you are looking to change the student's name in the <u>Acacia</u> platform.
- Once a student has logged in with their test ticket, it is no longer possible to change the student name associated with that test registration. <u>Please request all chosen name changes prior to</u> <u>providing the test tickets to the students.</u>


Preparing for NAEP 2026 – Understanding the Context




- New <u>frameworks</u> for the NAEP <u>mathematics</u> and <u>reading</u> assessments
- Continue the transition to administer NAEP on school devices.
 - The designation as school device or NAEP device is visible on the school page in the NAEP Assessment Management System (AMS)
 - A small number of schools will be automatically assigned to the NAEP device administration model as part of a small comparability study.
 - Students at schools designated as "school device" will be assessed using school devices and school Wi-Fi for 2026.
 - Students at schools designated as "NAEP device" will be assessed on NAEP devices using a NAEP provided private network.
 - iOS devices are scheduled to be added for NAEP 2028.
- Assessment dates will be provided in late October/ early November.

Technology Timeline NAEP 2026




NAEP 2026 School Technology Survey Results








NAEP 2026 October Priorities

- A small number of device eligible schools are assigned to the NAEP device administration model as a part of a small comparability study of administration on school devices versus NAEP devices.








NAEP 2026 – Where will I find... the model designation?








NAEP 2026 – Where will I find... the scheduled assessment date?


School Device Application Installer


Purpose: deploys the NAEP Assessment application to school devices

- Safelisting URLs
- Identifying devices to be used for the assessment
- Install and verify the NAEP Assessment application

Can be identified now

- Required for all schools assigned to the school devices model (M/R)
 - Receives an <u>automatic email</u> with instructions upon identification in AMS
 - Email can be resent from the STS manager or on the School Team tile by deleting and re-adding the contact information
 - Application Installer does not have AMS access
 - May have access to the AMS in another role (such as the DTD, TC, or DOC)






NAEP 2026 – How do I assign... a School Coordinator?





NAEP 2026 Next Steps

- Identify School Coordinators (primary point of contact for the NAEP assessment).
- Invite School Coordinators to Register for AMS (if not the principal).
- Complete Grade Information Questions (prior to November 1, 2025).
- Provide responses to designated grade information questions prior to the student list submission.
- Review Technical Requirements (for schools identified for school device administration)
- Review the technical specifications required for NAEP assessment administration and relay any concerns they may have about using school devices.
- Identify an Application Installer (if not already identified in the AMS).

1% Participation Timeline for SAU Action Plans

October Enrollment Deadline - Maine SAUs are asked to have their estimated identification of students that will participate in alternate assessments. Alternate flags must be checked in Synergy. This also includes students with a concurrent placement, such as a regional or out of state program.

9/22/25 -12/19/25 - Based on the Spring 2025 administration the Maine Department of Education will calculate the percentage of students who were assessed through an alternate assessment in each SAU. All Maine SAUs above the 1% will receive a letter with a request for an action plan from the Department. Action Plans will be due by 12/19/2025.





1% Action Plans

Maine SAUs will receive customized action plan templates including AA-AAS participation data for the Spring 2025 administration.

Action Plans include the following components:

- Current percentage of alternate assessment students, and historical participation data
- Justification of overage including participation of eligible students
- Action Plan
 - outline of proposed strategies
 - goals
 - student demographic information
 - parental engagement
- Requested MDOE support
