For those Sponsors completing the Verification Report in CNPweb, this information is for YOU.

For those Sponsor who collect Meal Benefit applications, the verification process is still required. The process starts in CNPweb, which will show you have many applications to verify.

There is a new section for reporting Directly Certified student. You will find it under the "Forms" section in CNPweb. You will select the "Verification Summary" tab.

The ONLY data you will enter is in the highlighted GREEN section; this is where you will report the number of students receiving the benefit because of the Direct Certification list.
