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SY2026 Annual Application to Participate in the School Nutrition Program

The annual application to participate in the School Nutrition Programs, including National School Lunch Program, School Breakfast Program, After School Snack Program is now available In CNPWeb.

<u>Program applications must be submitted and approved by State</u>
<u>Agency prior to operating.</u> Instructions are available under the "Help" tab once you are logged into CNPWeb.

As a reminder, on the "Checklist" tab, there are required documents that need to be uploaded by the Superintendent/Legal Agent to complete your application process. The required documents will be checked once you have opened your Sponsor and Site Information Sheets.

Annual Financial Report

- The Annual Financial Report is found in CNPWeb under the Forms tab in program 2025
- The Guide to complete the report is in the Help Tab
- Report must be submitted by September 1, 2025
- Make sure all Revenue and Expenses have been reported for SY 2025 before completing the Annual Financial Report.
- Verify that the beginning and ending balance in your AFR are the same as the Business Office
- Ending balance for the 2025 school year must be a positive balance.
 If the balance is negative, the sponsor is required to cover the difference with a transfer of non-federal funds to the Child Nutrition accounts for a zero balance

Changes to State Local Foods Fund (LFF) Coming Soon!!

Starting in September, the State Local Foods Fund will have some changes!

- Recent legislation has increased the reimbursement rate from 1/3 to 1/2!
 - Districts will now receive \$1 for every \$2 spent on eligible local foods!
- The maximum reimbursement amount has increased from \$5,000 to \$10,000!
 - Districts will also receive an extra \$1,000 for attending a local foods training!
- State Local Foods Fund Claims will be filed in CNP Web again with your monthly claim!
 - There will be a new claim form starting in September!

<u>Due to these changes, there will be mandatory training video to watch before filing your September claim in October.</u> This will be available starting in August.

These changes are effective starting for SEPTEMBER claims in October. Until then, please continue to email your Local Foods Fund claims as usual to katie.knowles@maine.gov.


Farm and Sea to School Office Hours

USDA Rate Changes for SY2025/26

National School Lunch, School Breakfast, and Special Milk Programs National Average Payments (July 1, 2025 - June 30, 2026)

Under the leadership of Secretary Brooke Rollins, USDA is committed to providing clear administrative requirements for nutrition programs. This notice announces the required annual adjustments to the national average payments that the Federal government provides for lunches, afterschool snacks, and breakfasts served to children participating in the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs, as well as the rate of reimbursement for a half-pint of milk served to children in a school or institution that participates in the Special Milk Program for Children.

National Average Payment Rates, Food Service Payment Rates, and Administrative Reimbursement Rates for the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) (July 1, 2025 - June 30, 2026)

Under the leadership of Secretary Brooke Rollins, USDA is committed to providing clear administrative requirements for the nutrition programs. This notice announces the required annual adjustments to the Child and Adult Care Food Program national average payment rates that the Federal government provides for meals and snacks served in child care centers, outside-school-hours care centers, at-risk afterschool care centers, and adult day care centers; the food service payment rates for meals and snacks served in day care homes; and the administrative reimbursement rates for sponsoring organizations of day care homes.

Regional Local Foods Coordinators

Maine Department of Education's Child Nutrition Office is hiring three regional local foods coordinators to support the department's efforts to promote locally sourced school meals in Maine's K-12 schools participating in the National School Lunch Program. These temporary, part-time positions run throughout the school year, from mid-September 2025 until June 30th, 2026.

These positions will support Child Nutrition's Maine Regional Local Foods Project. The objective of this project is to expand and deepen the impact of Farm & Sea to School programming in schools, including local procurement for school meals and activities that promote locally grown and caught food in the cafeteria.

For School Year 2025-2026, we have 3 coordinator positions available for the following regions:

- Penquis (Penobscot, Piscataquis, Somerset Counties)
- Washington County
- Kennebec Valley (Waldo & Kennebec Counties)

Applications are due by end of day August 6th. The anticipated position start date is September 15th, 2025.
