The first monthly order of School Year 2027 is available from September 1st-15th.

Items ordered in September will be delivered in October.

Step by step instructions on how to complete your order can be found on the [USDA Foods](#) page of our website.

Please review both your district's Sponsor and Delivery Sheets to ensure all information is accurate and up to date.

Follow the steps below:

1. Go to [CNPWeb](#)
 2. Enter your **ID and password**.
 3. Select **FDP (Food Distribution Program)**.
 4. Select **Program Year 2027**.
 5. Locate your **Sponsor Name** by selecting the first letter of your sponsor's name or by entering your **Sponsor Number**.
 6. Select your district to open the **Sponsor Summary** page.
 7. From the **Sponsor Summary** page, select **Applications-View or Revise** to review and update your **Sponsor Application Sheet and Delivery Location Information Sheets** as needed.
 8. Once changes are submitted, the status will change to "Pending Approval."
 9. DOE will review and approve the updated sheets.

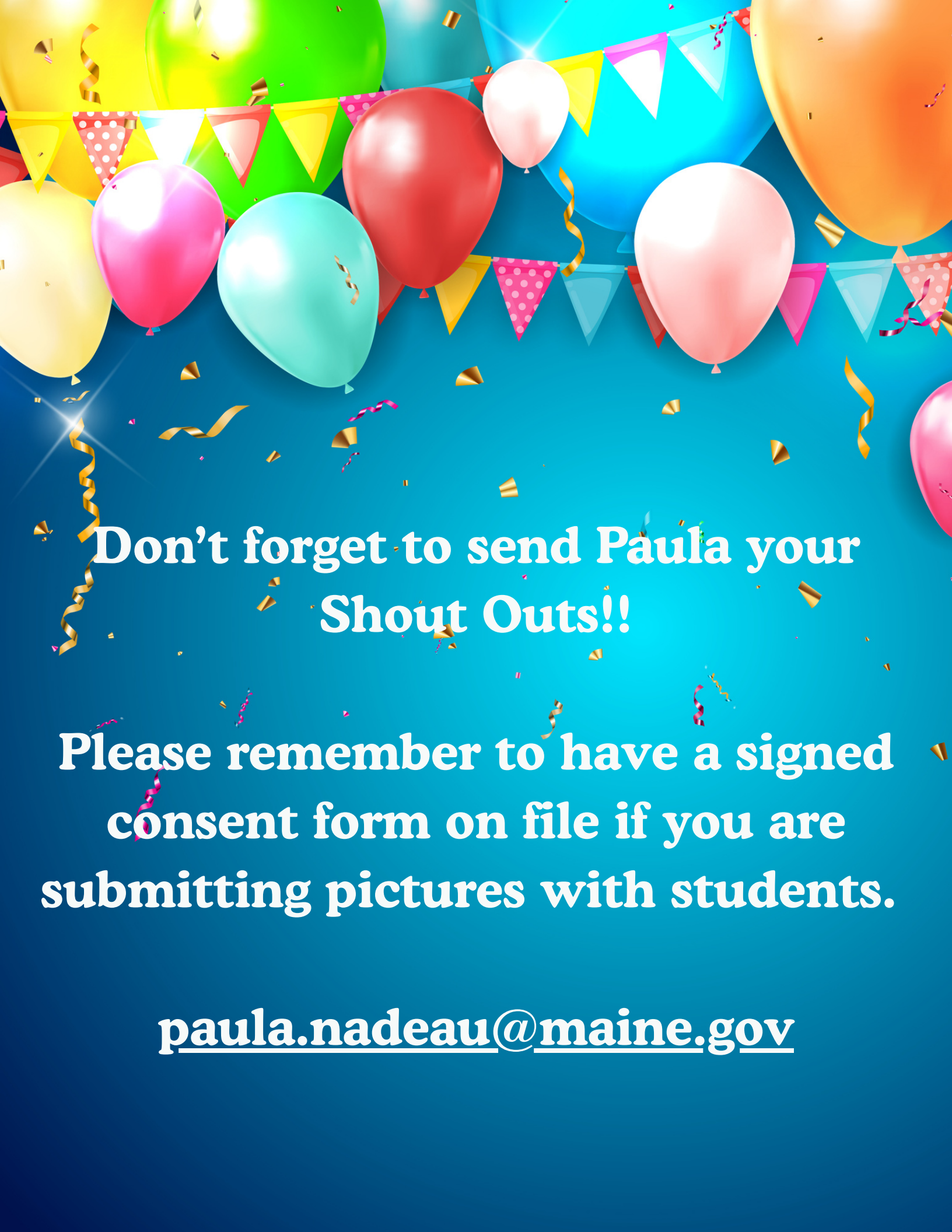


Bridging Cultures and Building Community Through Local Seafood
