

## Multilingual Learner Data Upload and Reporting Checklist

The following data needs to be <u>collected</u> by whoever is responsible for initial screening and identification of students for multilingual programming in your School Administrative Unit (SAU.)

Data then needs to be <u>shared</u> with those individuals responsible for Multilingual Learner data upload and reporting in your School Administrative Unit (SAU.)

## Required Multilingual Learner Service Codes and Uploads in Local Student Information System (SIS)

Multilingual Learner	This date should match the date of screener administration (PreK screener or WIDA
(ML) Start Date	Screener Online) that determines ML status.
Native Language	If a student has multiple home languages reported, including English, and qualifies
	as a multilingual learner, indicate the language other than English in the native
*Also referred to as	language field.
Primary and/or	English can be entered as a secondary language if reported on the language use
Home Language	survey.
ML Service Delivery	Reference ESOL/Bilingual Program Types for State Data Collection located on
Model	Maine DOE website
	The <i>most</i> represented program types in Maine SAUs are:
	-English as Second Language (ESL) or English Language Development (ELD)
	-Content Classes with Integrated ESL support
	Reminder: "Parents Refuse ML Services" is not a program model; it can only

## **Additional Data Considerations for Multilingual Learners**

Multilingual Learner	Multilingual learners who have achieved a composite score of 4.5 or above on the
(ML) Exit Date	ACCESS for ELLs (K-12) or P2 (prior to 2024) on Alternate ACCESS* (K-12) are exited
	from ML services in State Synergy by Maine DOE Data Team.
	*Maine DOE is currently in the process of working with concordance data to
	establish new exit criteria for Alternate ACCESS due to assessment redesign.
	SAUs cannot enter ML Exit Dates into State Synergy.
	The only other pathway for exiting a student from ML status is through the <i>Protocol</i>
	for Requesting a Change in Multilingual Learner Identification.
2 Year Monitor	Per federal guidance, SAUs are to monitor the performance of formerly identified
Status	students who are multilingual learners for at least two years after exiting. See
	further explanation in Maine DOE <u>Administrative Letter 27</u> .
Identified	Enter identified language/s for translation for families/guardians in your SIS
language/s for	Reminder: There can be multiple languages identified; translation is for written
translation	communication from SAU to families/guardians.
Identified	Enter identified language/s for interpretation for families/guardians in your SIS
language/s for	Reminder: There can be multiple languages identified; interpretation is for oral
interpretation	communication between SAU and families/guardians.
