Disclosure of Children's Free & Reduced-Price Meal Eligibility Information:

The agency/center may disclose information about children eligible for Free and Reduced-Price meals to any party without parental notification and consent when children cannot be identified through release of the aggregate data or by means of deduction.

Persons Authorized to Receive Eligibility Information:

• Only persons directly connected with the administration/enforcement of a program may have access to children's Free meal eligibility information without parental consent.

Disclosure of Children's Names and Free or Reduced-Price Meal Eligibility Status:

The agency/center may disclose, without parental consent, only children's names and F or R-P eligibility to:

- Federal education programs;
- State health or education programs;
- Federal, State, or local means-tested nutrition programs w/ eligibility standards comparable to the NSLP; or
- Third party contractors assisting in the verification of eligibility.

Disclosure of ALL Eligibility Information:

The agency/center may disclose, without parental consent, eligibility information to:

- Persons directly connected with administering or enforcing the NSLP, SMP, SBP, SFSP, and WIC;
- US Comptroller General;
- Federal, State or local law enforcement officials.

<u>Use of Free and R-P Meal Eligibility Information by Programs Other than Medicaid</u> (MaineCare) or SCHIP:

- State agencies and child care institutions may use children's Free meal eligibility information for administering/enforcing the CACFP;
- Federal, State or local agencies for administering/enforcing the CACFP;
- No further disclosure of this information may be made.

<u>Disclosure of Children's Free or R-P Meal Eligibility Information to Medicaid</u> (MaineCare) and/or SCHIP (unless parents decline):

- Children's F or R-P meal eligibility information may only be disclosed to Medicaid (MaineCare) or SCHIP when both the State agency and child care institution so elect and the parent does not decline;
- The State agency or child care institution may disclose children's names, F or R-P eligibility status or other eligibility information obtained through the IEF or direct certification to persons connected to the administration of Medicaid (MaineCare)/SCHIP;
- Parents must be notified their eligibility information may be disclosed and given the opportunity to decline.

<u>Use of Children's F or R-P Meal Eligibility Information by Medicaid</u> (MaineCare)/SCHIP:

 Medicaid (MaineCare)/SCHIP agencies and health insurance program operators receiving children's F and R-P eligibility information must use the information to seek to enroll them in Medicaid (MaineCare)/SCHIP and disclose no further information. Medicaid (MaineCare)/SCHIP agencies and health insurance programs may verify eligibility information in a Child Nutrition program.

Notifying Households of Potential Uses and Disclosures of Children's F or R-P Meal Eligibility Information:

- For disclosure to programs other than Medicaid (MaineCare)/SCHIP, households must be notified at the time of application that the information provided on their child's IEF may be disclosed to other programs;
- For disclosure to Medicaid (MaineCare)/SCHIP, households must be notified their child's eligibility status will be disclosed unless the parent declines.

Other Disclosures:

• Children's parents must provide written consent prior to the disclosure of information to any other program not previously listed.

<u>Agreements with Programs/Individuals Receiving Children's F or R-P Eligibility</u> Information:

• The State agency or child care institution should have a written agreement with programs or individuals receiving eligibility information prior to disclosing said information.
