| Opening                      | Yesterday we explored words with multiple meanings. Today you will choose one of the words we explored and write two sentences, one to demonstrate each of the word's meanings.   |  |
| <b>Discussion</b> slides 2-8 | Quickly review the two definitions for each word discussed on Day 3.  |  |
| slide 9                      | Choose one of the words we discussed—"still," "judge," or "foundation."  Then, write two sentences that demonstrate different definitions of that word.  Send children to write independently or with a partner. Circulate to support them, reviewing the different definitions as necessary. |  |
|                              | Bring the class back together. Invite a child to share their sentences. As a class, discuss how the sentences demonstrate the different meanings of the word. Repeat the process with other children, as time allows.   |  |
