





Reading together builds language skills sparks childrens' imagination, creates bonds, and lasting family memories.

Have a routine

Try to read together every day.

Warm up

Check out the cover. Read the title and author/illustrator names. Look at the pictures. Ask your child what they think the story is about.

Change your voice

Make the book extra fun by trying different voices for different characters.

Pause for new words

Books are a great way to learn new words. Talk about the words your child doesn't know.

Ask questions

"How...? What ...? Why ...?" questions.

Talk about feelings

Point to a person in the book and ask. "How is he feeling?" and "Why do you think so?"

Make personal connections

Look for story connections. For example, "Do you remember when we made soup? What did we put in ours?"

Switch roles

Pick a favorite book you have read to them before and have them "read" or retell the story to you. They can tell you what is happening by looking at the pictures.

Underline the words as you read This helps children learn the direction in which we read and write.
