


Unit 1: Our Community

Dear Families,

This is the second week of school, and the second week of our study about **community**. Children are continuing to learn classroom routines and expectations. They are also learning about our school community. We are reading **Abuela** by Arthur Dorros and Elisa Klevens—a story about a grandmother and granddaughter who *fly* around their own community!



This week with your child try some of the activities below. Please help your child return the sheet to school at the end of the week. We hope you enjoy learning together.

Go outside / Bring the outside in As you travel around your town, talk with your child about the places you see and what happens in them.	Shared Reading Find the poem on the back of this page. Read it aloud a few times and ask your child to chime in or repeat some lines back.	
Talk about it If you could fly, where would you like to go? Why would you like to go there? What do you think you would see there? Have you made a new friend this week? If yes, what makes them your friend?	Read together! at least 20 minutes every day	Play with math ideas Coming soon!
Explore science and engineering Coming soon!	Play with sounds to grow a reader Say a word aloud. Ask your child: What sound do you hear at the beginning of this word? Then say three more words that begin with the same sound (not letter). Start with these words: bat (/b/), top (/t/), fan (/f/) IMPORTANT: When you see these: / /, make the sound, don't say the letter.
