


Unit 1: Our Community

Week 5

Dear Families,

We are continuing to explore ideas about community. This week we are reading *The Name Jar* by Yangsook Choi. Just like in the book, children are thinking about the importance of one's name and about being a new member of a community.



This week, try some of the activities below with your child. You can use the back of this page for drawing, writing stories, or anything else you'd like to share. Please help your child return the sheet to school at the end of the week. We hope you enjoy learning together.

Go outside / Bring the outside in

Shared Reading

Find the poem on the back of this page. Read it aloud a few times and ask your child to chime in or repeat some lines back. Talk about what the poem means.

Talk about it

Invite your child to name some of the children in our classroom. Ask them if anyone's name starts with the same sound as their own. Write out your child's name, cut it up, and then help your child put the letters in order.

Read together!

at least 20 minutes every day

Play with math ideas

Invite your child to count the feet of people you live with you. Ask them to choose another body part that they can count.

Explore science and engineering

Children are observing the weather this week. Invite your child to have a conversation about what you both notice about the weather.

Play with sounds

Say a word aloud. Ask your child: What **sound** do you hear at the beginning of this word?

Then say two more words that begin with the same sound (not letter). Try these words:

/a/: apple, alligator, avocado

/g/: game, girl, gift /c/: carnival, car, kind

IMPORTANT: When you see these: / /, make the sound, don't

say the letter.
