Which schools are eligible for the Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program (FFVP)?

- Schools that operate the National School Lunch Program
- Schools that serve students in grades K-8 or have the ability to separate elementary school students in a K-12 program
- Schools with 50% or more students eligible for free or reduced price meals



What are the program benefits for <u>students</u>?

- Increases consumption of fresh fruits and vegetables among students
- Students experience new and unfamiliar fruits and vegetables while having fun
- Students become accustomed to eating fruits and vegetables on a regular basis

What are the program benefits for <u>schools</u>?
