

Reporting Groups

In order for individuals with the instructor role to be able to see student score results in Acacia, Reporting groups must be created. Directions for creating Reporting groups can be found in Part 7 of the <u>User and</u> <u>Student Management Guide</u>.

SAU Data Clean-Up Checklist

Data clean-up is a vital component of the assessment cycle that ensures both that the Student Score Data File available in Acacia contains accurate information and that SAUs receive MAP Growth reports containing Maine Through Year Assessment RIT score data. The data clean-up window is scheduled for February 26 through March 1, but please note that SAUs can begin many data clean-up tasks from the <u>checklist</u>, such as uploading rosters into the MAP Growth platform, now.

Professional Learning Opportunities

Understanding Scores from the Maine Through Year Assessment

During this virtual workshop, participants will learn about the characteristics and purposes of the two score types produced by the Maine Through Year Assessment. Participants will interact with student RIT score and Maine-specific scale score data to develop a deeper understanding of the purpose and value of, as well as the similarities and differences between, these two measures of student performance.

Please remember that parents/guardians of students selected for NAEP must be notified prior to the assessment. The notification dates for students must be entered and certified in the NAEP Assessment Management System. Upcoming activities for School Coordinators include:

- Notifying families of the students. Parent/guardian notification letters are available in English and Spanish with in the NAEP Assessment Management System. These letters are also available in the top ten languages spoken by the families of Maine's students. The translations for the Parent Notification letters are located on the top of the <u>National and International Assessment page</u> of the Maine DOE Assessment Team Resources. *This is a new location*. The families of students selected for NAEP should be notified at least one week in advance. You may also elect to notify the parents of all students in the selected grade that their students may be selected to participate in the assessment.
- *Plan to be onsite and available* before as well as during the administration of the assessment on the day of the assessment.

NAEP preparation activities for On-site Technology Coordinators include:

- Work with school or district technology staff as necessary to add the email domain westatstudies.com to the safe senders list;
- **Complete Internet Speed tests in each room** that will be used for the assessment one week prior to the scheduled assessment date.
 - Contact your school coordinator for these locations.
 - If you have not already done so, please assist with safelisting URLs. A complete list is located in the NAEP Assessment Management System.
- *Plan to be onsite and available* before as well as during the administration of the assessment on the day of the assessment.

February NAEP Nugget:

The <u>National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) survey questionnaires</u> are completed by students, teachers, and school administrators at schools participating in a NAEP assessment. Survey questionnaires collect additional information about students' demographics and K-12 education experiences. The responses collected via these questionnaires provide important information for educators, policymakers, and researchers to better understand the context in which students learn, and, in turn, can lead to improvement of teaching and learning in our nation's classrooms.

What's up and coming with the International Assessments:

Program for International Student Assessment (PISA)

The Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development's (OECD) Program for International Student Assessment (PISA) evaluates education systems worldwide by assessing 15-year-olds in key subjects. This summer PISA plans to release the results of the 2022 administration of the PISA Financial Literacy assessment. Data and information from earlier releases and previous assessments are available from the <u>National Center</u> of Education Statistics and from the <u>OECD</u>.

The focus of PISA 2015 was science. A <u>number of released items</u> are available to allow the public the opportunity to experience and understand more about the PISA 2015 science assessments. One can also explore the concepts and competencies assessed as well as learn what 15-year-olds students at different proficiency levels can do.
