Importance of SLIFE Families and Community Engagement

Students With Limited or Interrupted Formal Education (SLIFE) Defined

- A language other than English is spoken at home
- Enter U.S. after grade 2
- Have at least 2 years less schooling
- Are at least 2 years below grade level
- Have gaps in their education
