

Solutionary Framework®

A four-phase process people can use to become solutionaries









I. IDENTIFY

- 1. Select a big issue to learn more about
- 2. Identify the problem you want to solve
- 3. Write your problem statement and initial questions to guide your investigation

II. INVESTIGATE

- 4. Connect with stakeholders
- 5. Investigate the impacts and causes of the problem
- 6. Research what has been done to solve the problem thus far

III. INNOVATE

- 7. Propose solutions that address causes of the problem, and which do the most good and least harm to people, animals, and the environment
- 8. Choose the solution that is most solutionary and most feasible to implement
- 9. Create a plan to implement your solution

IV. IMPLEMENT

- 10. Implement an actionable element of your solution
- 11. Present your solutionary work
- 12. Assess, reflect, iterate, and celebrate

Nuts and Bolts

- Format: Daylong in-person kickoff followed by four 1-hour zooms, four short online modules and 1:1 support
- Cohorts are limited to 20 ideal size is 15-16
- Lots of tools, examples, topic focused resources and support from cohort-based Maine-based coaches
- \$1000 stipend and Solutionary Micro-credential for teachers who complete the course and submit a plan
- Participate with a school team work together on one plan!
- \$400 project funds also available to teachers who finish
