I have started as a new superintendent as of September 1. 2018. I have experienced the depth of the talent and interest for the Gifted and Talented Programs. We need some time to make sure we follow all the expectations of the GT Grant and regulations and have an approved Gifted and Talented Program by the School Board. The Gifted and Talented teaching staff for MSAD 49 is comprised of Lori LaPorte a certified Gifted and Talented teacher, Dr. Reza Namin, and Roberta Hersom. Each of us works in a number of different schools within the district. The shape and scope of Gifted and Talented services in our district vary depending on factors such as grade level, group size and area of study. We work with students in grades K through 12. Some students receive differentiated instruction from their teacher within the classroom, others meet with a Gifted and Talented teacher in their regular classroom, and others are pulled out of their regular classroom to participate in Virtual School for Gifted and Talented accelerated or compacted lessons. These opportunities for expanding and deepening the curriculum cover the core academic areas (language arts, humanities, science and math) and the arts (music and visual arts).
