An Administrative Review of the Northport Public Schools Nutrition Program was conducted on December 12, 2018. We appreciated the assistance given by you and your staff.

The enclosed Official Notification of Review Findings and Corrective Action describes the corrective action documentation and completion dates discussed during the exit conference. Please return a signed copy of this Official Notification when submitting the corrective action documentation. **Please provide the corrective action documentation by January 4, 2019.** Failure to do this may result in the withholding of reimbursement payments until it is received and/or a follow-up visit verifies that corrective action has been determined as acceptable. We hope that following the exit conference you and your staff addressed the corrective actions and that you will have no problems in meeting the response deadline.

The Official Notification also provides the potential fiscal action, which is an initial estimate of the amount of reimbursement that will be reclaimed. These are only estimates which must be adjusted to the actual date of corrective action for each violation. If documentation of corrective action or acceptable corrective action is not received by the response date stated above, the claim will be recalculated to the end of the school year.

Administrative Review Report Northport Public School Nutrition Program December 12, 2019

Introduction

The Northport Public School Nutrition Program was reviewed based on Federal Regulation 7CFR 210.18 and Maine Department of Education, Child Nutrition policies and procedures.

Performance Standard 1: Meal Access and Reimbursement

<u>Certification and Benefit Issuance</u>- Corrective action is required.

- One meal benefit application was incorrectly approved.
- One Student approved as free did not have an application on file.

Verification- No findings.

<u>Meal Counting and Claiming</u>- The district uses the electronic point of service (POS) system, Nutrikids, to track reimbursable meals. The staff members that help were skilled at identifying reimbursable meals and ensuring students selected the required meal components of a reimbursable meal. No problems were observed.

Meal counts from the November 2018 District Claim for Reimbursement were validated and no errors were discovered.

Performance Standard 2: Meal Pattern and Nutritional Quality

Meal Components and Quantities- No findings

Production Records: Production records are used to support the claiming of meals and therefore, must document the items offered and quantities served as part of a reimbursable meal. Production records were filled out completely but technical assistance was provided in regards to filling out the serving size of items. Because some items credit differently the actual serving size should be recorded and not the crediting amount.

Resource Management

For SY 2018, revenues and expenses were obtained from the Monthly Income and Expenses report found in NEO. Town support in the amount of \$35,000 is not included in our comparison of expenses to revenue below:

Looking at this it appears that labor costs are very high.

Paid Lunch Equity (PLE)- The program has complied with the PLE requirement.

Meal Charging- The School Nutrition Program has a charging policy/procedure.

Indirect Costs- No findings

General Program Compliance

Records and Record Keeping- Reports are submitted to the State Agency in a timely fashion and program records are kept for three years, as required.

<u>Food Safety and Sanitation</u>- Health Inspection reports were not displayed for public view, this will need to be corrected. A sample meal was available. Written food safety Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) were on file. Corrective action is required.

Civil Rights- No findings.

On-Site Monitoring- No findings.

Wellness Policy - The wellness policy was reviewed and the following elements were missing:

 Policy for food and beverage marketing consistent with Maine statute §6662 (3) Food and beverage advertising

An updated wellness policy was approved on 12-11-18 and was sent to the reviewer.

<u>Training/Professional Standards</u>- Training is in progress for this year, Kristine should be able to meet her hours.

After School Snack Program- No findings.

<u>Corrective Action-</u> Corrective action is required as a result of this Administrative Review. The enclosed form outlines what is required. A detailed response and documentation of the corrective action must be returned to our office by the date specified, along with the enclosed form signed by the Superintendent.

Summary

The Nutrition program at Northport is doing well. I would encourage them to consider alternative breakfast models like breakfast in the classroom to help boost breakfast participation. Overall I am confident in the success of this program.
