<p>The plan is to schedule four to six meetings for interested schools to work collaboratively with a consultant to develop effective safety processes for their own school. We have estimated six schools for the cohort. By working together, schools will be able to share ideas and to have ownership of the outcomes while tailoring the policy for their school. Participants will be able to take completed policies with them after each session.</p>	<p>The Safety Cohort 2016 met in different capacities from Nov2015 to May2016. The groups drafted outlines for 22 different safety policy (schemas). A total of 10 CTE schools participated in the meetings and trainings. Schools did receive a final draft version of all the schemas and will receive a final copy once vetted versions by the Maine Department of Labor-SafetyWorks division.</p>	<p>Completed</p> <p>23 schemas were created. Each schema includes the following: schema details, sample training, inspection checklist, OSHA references and duty rosters.</p>
<p>Included in the plan are tools that will allow schools to conduct effective facility inspections such as; Electrical outlet testers, Cameras, Gap Testers, Moisture meters, Infrared Thermometer, Electrical Probe, Tape Measure and a tool pouch.</p>	<p>8 complete kits were ordered and distributed to the members.</p>	<p>Completed.</p> <p>Each kit was tested and confirmed to work as expected.</p>
