CRRSA ESSER 2 Close Out Terms

creation are available for obligation by SAUs through september 30, 2023, which includes the Tydings period

Any funds not invoiced by 12/30/2023 will no longer be accessible.

CRRSA ESSER 2 Spending Facts:

- \$25.4m, of the \$165.4m, allocated to SAUs is remaining
- 27 of Maine's SAUs have > 30% remaining
- Only 23 calendar days left to obligate funds
- Approximately 119 days to fully invoice (liquidate)



§ 76.707 When obligations are made.

The table shows when a State or a subgrantee makes obligations for various kinds of property and services.

The period for delivery of goods and services and exchange of funds can extend to the end of the liquidation period, so long as timely and valid obligation had been made pursuant to 34 CFR 76.707.

If the obligation is for -	The obligation is made -	
(a) Acquisition of real or personal property	On the date on which the State or subgrantee makes a binding written commitment to acquire the property.	
(b) Personal services by an employee of the State or subgrantee	When the services are performed.	
(c) Personal services by a contractor who is not an employee of the State or subgrantee	On the date on which the State or subgrantee makes a binding written commitment to obtain the services.	
(d) Performance of work other than personal services	On the date on which the State or subgrantee makes a binding written commitment to obtain the work.	
(e) Public utility services	When the State or subgrantee receives the services.	
(f) Travel	When the travel is taken.	
(g) Rental of real or personal property	When the State or subgrantee uses the property.	
(h) A pre-agreement cost that was properly approved by the Secretary under the cost principles in 2 CFR part 200, Subpart E - Cost Principles	On the first day of the grant or subgrant performance period.	



Inventory, Items Purchased w. ESSER

- All property purchased and reimbursed with CRRSA ESSER 2 funds must be properly inventoried.
- It is the responsibility of the SAU to have a procedure identified for tracking and inventorying property purchased.
- The procedure must meet 2 CFR Part 200.302(b)(7) and 2 CFR Part 200.319(C).
- A physical inventory of the property must be completed, and the results reconciled with property records at least once every two years. (2 CFR 200.313 4d)



Physical Inventory Requirements

- Unique, self-determine inventory number;
- Item description including make and model;
- Each individual model and serial number to reflect the number of items purchased;
- Vendor or source of purchase;
- Acquisition date;
- Cost per unit; VII. The condition of the property;
- The physical location of the property; and
- Note any safeguarding measures of the property.

Each item will need to be tagged with the inventory number, funding source, and the owner of the property



Federally Funded Disclaimer

- When issuing statements, press releases, requests for proposals, bid solicitations and other documents describing projects or programs funded in whole or in part with Federal money, U.S. Department of Education grantees shall clearly state:
- the percentage of the total costs of the program or project which will be financed with Federal money;
- 2) the dollar amount of Federal funds for the project or program; and
- 3) the percentage and dollar amount of the total costs of the project or program that will be financed by non-governmental sources. Recipients must comply with these conditions under Division H, Title V, Section 505 of Public Law 113-76, Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2014.
- **Example 1:** ARP funds received from the USDOE support the procurement of a student transportation vehicle. The vehicle purchase totaled \$105,000, of which 50% was ARP funded and 50% was from non-governmental sources. The vehicle was procured by the school administration unit and its make and design do not necessarily represent makes or designs endorsed by the USDOE, U.S. Government, or Maine DOE.
- **Example 2:** ARP funds received from the USDOE supported the procurement of digital video and communication technology used in this office. The technology was procured using \$45,000 of ARP funding, which was fully funded with ARP funds. The technology was selected and procured by the school administrative unit and does not necessarily represent the official endorsement for its use by the USDOE, U.S. Government, or Maine DOE.



Late Liquidation EXTENSION

- On September 19, 2023 at 11 am, the OFERP team will offer an informational session to describe the required late liquidation extension application process for CRRSA ESSER 2 funds.
- **IMPORTANT**: Only activities that have been <u>properly</u> and <u>timely obligated</u> by September 30, 2023 may be considered for late liquidation extension.

Federal Emergency Relief Programs

The CRRSA ESSER II funding must be obligated by September 30, 2023. An obligation is the legal liability to pay immediately or at a later date. A table illustrating when a sub-recipient has made an obligation is available in 2 CFR § 76.707 **Important**

The Maine Department of Education (DOE) has received \$1,021,690,359 in federal emergency relief funding to improve student learning, address unfinished learning, support students mental health and combat pandemic-related challenges. The three federal emergency relief acts are:

- Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act enacted on March 27, 2020 to address the impact that COVID-19 has had, and continues to have, on elementary and secondary schools.
- Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations (CRRSA) Act enacted on December 27, 2020 to prevent, prepare for, and respond to COVID-19 related to addressing learning loss, preparing schools for reopening, and testing, repairing, and upgrading projects to improve air quality in school buildings.
- American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act enacted on March 11, 2021 to safely reopen and sustain the safe operation of schools and address the impact of the coronavirus pandemic.



OFERP Friendly Reminders

- The UEI number will never expire; however, entity registrations do expire annually and require annual renewal.
- Reimbursement requests should be processed monthly, ideally, but cannot span more than three months
- Reimbursement requests cannot:
 - Span different fiscal years (July to June)
 - Will not be processed with an unapproved and/or opened application
- Please note that reimbursement requests should not be deleted once the invoice has been created.
