What is the Pathways Project?

The Pathways Project is a collaboration between Maine Department of Education, Child Development Services and the University of Maine to offer an affordable and high-quality accelerated master's degree program. Graduates will be eligible for the Maine 282B-5 teaching endorsement.

How many courses do I complete each semester?

Scholars will complete 2-3 courses per semester (6-9 credits). The master's degree is a minimum of 33 credits. A review of prior transcripts will occur and eligible courses will be applied to your program.

How many scholars will be selected for the scholarship opportunity?

We anticipate selecting as many scholars as are interested.

How much financial support will be provided to scholars?

Scholars will receive full support for tuition, fees, and textbooks..

Is there a service agreement?

Yes, scholars will be expected to work in Maine in early childhood settings (birth-5) for two years following completion of the project.
