If a child has transportation as a special education service in the IEP, the district must provide it or arrange to have it provided. Transportation requirements will vary depending on the availability of universal pre k. Please reach out to Sandy and Jen if you have specific questions. You may transport children just as you would K students. Expectation is for the drivers to have training around transporting younger children. 	

			 Some schools have used funding to provide safety harness, purchased smaller buses or vans. Some districts employ an extra adult to ride the bus. Some schools have also started the year with an additional adult on the bus and then, once routines are set, will pull the extra adult from the bus. This has been successful. Of the SAUs in Maine that offer public Pre-K, majority of them do provide transportation for their Pre-K Students. If you are having challenges with transportation, we can work with each district individually.
