

Certification and Higher Education Committee Maine State Board of Education Minutes of the October 16, 2024 Meeting

The Certification and Higher Education Committee held a virtual monthly meeting on Wednesday, October 16, 2024, via Zoom. The following members were present: Chair Tom Keller, Victoria Kornfield and Denham Ward, Committee members, and Emily Cummins supported the meeting. Fern Desjardins, chair of the SBE, and Paulette Bonneau, vice chair, also attended.

1. <u>Call to Order</u> - Chair Keller called the meeting to order at 10:33 am. Tori and Denham introduced themselves, as did Tom, Fern and Paulette.

2. Approval of Minutes

MOTION by Denham Ward, seconded by Tori Kornfield, and unanimously voted by committee members to accept the September 25, 2024 minutes as presented. The motion passed.

3. Public Comment

No public comments were offered.

4. Higher Education Update - as reported by Michael Perry

- A. Michael reported that the team was finalizing the Thomas College EPP report and that report would be coming to the C&HE Committee. The graduate program needs to take a different route to approval and he was working on that.
- B. Michael has determined that Beal University has degree granting authority at the associates level and the State Board needs to finalize approval at the bachelors level. Documentation seems to support that this was done but no official paperwork can be located. Beal has submitted an application for masters level degrees and was given temporary approval by the MDOE. Their masters programs are accredited by the Accrediting Commission of Career Schools and Colleges (ACCSC) but it is unclear if this is appropriate for both MBA and Masters in Family Nurse Partitioner programs. Denham noted that there is a Maine State Board of Nursing and thought a joint review would be reasonable.

Michael and Denham are the leads on beginning a conversation with the principals at Beal University to determine next steps in degree granting authority. They are to keep Tom informed as well.

There will be a UM off cycle review on October 30. Tori will serve as the SBE Observer.

- C. Regarding Syracuse University, Michael is checking with NC-SARA and Sarah Forster to confirm the validation of the Syracuse/Edward Little High School course offering.
- D. No information on pertinent legislation was related.
- E. Michael noted that a new institution offering a degree in architecture was in the beginning stages of applying under chapter 149.
- 5. Certification update as reported by Michael Perry
- A. Michael supplied the committee with the usual slides on application processed last month as well as cumulative data. In September, 2,942 applications were processed. See Attached.

We continue to have a small number of retired teachers take advantage of legislation to regain their certification. Processing time has increased a little and now averages 3 to 3.5 weeks.

B. The MEIS system is up for revamping through a new RFP that has been posted in the Kennebec Journal and on the state website. Information is posted at State of Maine Department of Education

She reported that UMPI is collaborating with UMM and UMA for a special education certification program that none of them could accomplish alone. On October 29, UMPI will hold a Future Teachers Academy Boot Camp for juniors and seniors. This has been very well received. UMPI is working with CACE on a new teachers support group.

7. LD 2221/Resolve to amend Chapter 115 - Tom Keller

Tom read the following statement: "Today the State Board of Education is providing an opportunity to deliver feedback on the current Chapter 115. This is not an opportunity for discussion, rather a neutral environment through which the public may provide feedback on the current version of this rule. The Board may ask clarifying questions, but will not be able to answer questions from the public at this time. If you have written copies of your comments available, please email those to laura.cyr@maine.gov and tkeller.sbe@gmail.com. All comments will be collected and reviewed before the revision process begins.

Public feedback on this rule will continue to be collected through December 2024 here at the CHE meetings and in a series of dedicated conversations that will begin in October. Those dates will be available at the next CHE meeting and will be published online."

Several people made comments and provided feedback on Chapter 115 including Christian Elkington, Sarah Howorth, and Jon Moody. All on the call were asked to submit their comments in writing to Laura and Tom.


While some discussion ensued, it was generally using the given comments to provide clarity on the issues being identified. Important concepts noted included:

- State Reciprocity and not assuming their standards are lower than ours
- Models for dual certification, especially with special education
- Use of portfolios or rubrics such as the HOUSSE (high objective uniform State standard of evaluation), and who evaluates them
- A 3 year emergency pathway
