

WHAT IS THIS MODULE?

The module focuses on how to collaborate with Wabanaki conservationists to bring attention to environmental issues that have a negative impact on what is now known as Maine and the Wabanaki way of life. The module emphasizes the importance of learning about the past and how it relates to current environmental issues, and how art can be used as a tool to create installations, presentations, or protests that highlight these issues.

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

Through this module, students will have the opportunity to learn about the Wabanaki's traditional ecological knowledge and their relationship with the land, as well as the impacts of colonization and environmental degradation on their way of life. By partnering with Wabanaki conservationists, students can gain a deeper understanding of these issues and learn about solutions and actions that can be taken to address them.

Moreover, this module can help to foster greater understanding, respect, and allyship between non-native and Wabanaki communities. It provides a framework for collaboration and partnership, emphasizing the importance of working together towards shared goals and solutions.
