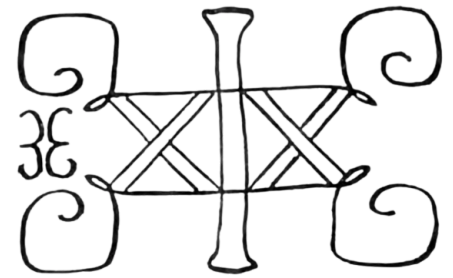


Wabanaki and the Environment:
