Eligible service providers participating in waiver and affirmation that they are in good standing: The waiver request is for the NSLP requirement that potable water available and accessible without restriction to children at no charge in the place(s) where lunches are served during the meal service.
- 4. Description of the challenge the State agency is seeking to solve, the goal of the waiver to improve services under the Program, and the expected outcomes if the waiver is granted. [Section 12(l)(2)(A)(iii) and 12(l)(2)(A)(iv) of the NSLA]: Due to COVID-19 restrictions, Sponsors may have trouble meeting the requirement to make potable water available and accessible without restriction to children at no charge during meal service. This request is to allow Sponsors to provide meals to students even if they are unable to provide access to potable water at no charge due to COVID-19 restrictions.
- 5. Specific Program requirements to be waived (include statutory and regulatory citations). [Section 12(l)(2)(A)(i) of the NSLA]: 7 CFR 210.10(a)(1)(i)
- 6. Detailed description of alternative procedures and anticipated impact on Program operations, including technology, State systems, and monitoring. Water fountain restrictions have been put in place related to COVID-19 that do not allow potable water to be easily accessible. Offering bottled water to students for free is an expense the program can not absorb either.
- 7. Description of any steps the State has taken to address regulatory barriers at the State level. [Section 12(l)(2)(A)(ii) of the NSLA]: Educate Maine DOE and local administrators of current methods under Federal and State regulations and what the waiver would allow. There are currently no state level regulatory barriers that would impact this issue.
- 8. Anticipated challenges State or eligible service providers may face with the waiver implementation: Communication and education about the ability to waive the potable water requirement.
- 9. Description of how the waiver will not increase the overall cost of the Program to the Federal Government. If there are anticipated increases, confirm that the costs will be paid from non-Federal funds. [Section 12(1)(1)(A)(iii) of the NSLA]: No cost increase
