

## Wrap-Around

When to use: recalling prior knowledge or responding to a shared experience

**Why to use**: quick method of finding common themes, revealing questions, and promoting active listening.

## Directions

- Provide a prompt. It may be a stem such as "When someone is rude to me . . ." or it may be an entire sentence. Have students write their first thought – 30 to 60 seconds.
- 2. Have student stand up and one at a time, read their response. If someone hears a response that is like their own, they stand near the first student and read their response.
- 3. Continue until all students have read their response.
- 4. Discuss themes and commonalities. Is anyone standing alone? What were they thinking?
