The following questions have been received:

Question: Could the department please provide a clear description of the contractor responsibilities associated with Item 202.20231 – Remove Pavement Surface, Medium Cut Drum (hourly)? Specifically, we are seeking clarification on whether tasks such as hauling, sweeping, or similar support activities are required to be included under this item.

Response: Please refer to Special Provision 202.20231 Removing Pavement Surface – Medium Cut Drum:

“The square yard or hourly rental contract price will be full compensation for mobilizing to the site, de-mobilizing from the site, labor, supervision, cleaning of the milled surface, and all other incidentals required to complete the work. Hauling and stockpiling of the material will not be paid for directly, but will be considered incidental to the milling items.”

Question: Special Provision Section 104 (Utilities) indicates a total of 62 WD’s for the local utility companies to make the required adjustments to their structures. The approximate working days in the contract are 89. Would the department consider adding an additional 20 WD’s to the contract to help alleviate congestion on these short sections of road with the contractor and local utilities completing work and adjustments in tight sections of road? There is work called out on 29704.00 that is only required if the work goes back into side roads, what would cause this to happen and how do we account or plan for it either way?

Response: The contractor shall coordinate/schedule the utility structure adjustments with the utilities within the allotted contract time.
