## CONTRACT AGREEMENT, OFFER & AWARD

AGREEMENT made on the date last signed below, by and between the State of Maine, acting through and by its Department of Transportation (Department), an agency of state government with its principal administrative offices located at Child Street, Augusta, Maine, with a mailing address at 16 State House Station, Augusta, Maine 04333-0016, and a corporation or other legal entity organized under the laws of the State of , with

The Department and the Contractor, in consideration of the mutual promises set forth in this Agreement (the "Contract"), hereby agree as follows:

#### A. The Work.

The Contractor agrees to complete all Work as specified or indicated in the Contract including Extra Work in conformity with the Contract, WIN 27462.00 for the Pavement Milling, Hot Mix Asphalt Overlay, with Drainage and Safety Improvements in the Town of Winslow and the City of Waterville, County of Kennebec, Maine. The Work includes construction, maintenance during construction, warranty as provided in the Contract, and other incidental work.

The Contractor shall be responsible for furnishing all supervision, labor, equipment, tools supplies, permanent materials and temporary materials required to perform the Work including construction quality control including inspection, testing and documentation, all required documentation at the conclusion of the project, warranting its work and performing all other work indicated in the Contract.

The Department shall have the right to alter the nature and extent of the Work as provided in the Contract; payment to be made as provided in the same.

#### B. Time.

The Contractor agrees to complete all Work, except warranty work, within <u>55</u> Working Days. Further, the Department may deduct from moneys otherwise due the Contractor, not as a penalty, but as Liquidated Damages in accordance with Sections 107.7 and 107.8 of the *State of Maine Department of Transportation Standard Specifications, March 2020 Edition* and related Special Provisions.

#### D. Contract.

This Contract, which may be amended, modified, or supplemented in writing only, consists of the Contract documents as defined in the Plans, *Standard Specifications, March 2020 Edition, Standard Details March 2020 Edition* as updated through advertisement, Supplemental Specifications, Special Provisions, Contract Agreement; and Contract Bonds. It is agreed and understood that this Contract will be governed by the documents listed above.

#### E. Certifications.

By signing below, the Contractor hereby certifies that to the best of the Contractor's knowledge and belief:

- 1. All of the statements, representations, covenants, and/or certifications required or set forth in the Bid and the Bid Documents, including those in the Federal Contract Provisions Supplement, and the Contract are still complete and accurate as of the date of this Agreement.
- 2. The Contractor knows of no legal, contractual, or financial impediment to entering into this Contract.
- 3. The person signing below is legally authorized by the Contractor to sign this Contract on behalf of the Contractor and to legally bind the Contractor to the terms of the Contract.

#### F. Offer.

The undersigned, having carefully examined the site of work, the Plans, Standard Specifications March 2020 Edition, Standard Details March 2020 Edition as updated through advertisement, Supplemental Specifications, Special Provisions, Contract Agreement; and Contract Bonds contained herein for construction of: WIN 27462.00 for the Pavement Milling, Hot Mix Asphalt Overlay, with Drainage and Safety Improvements in the Town of Winslow and the City of Waterville, County of Kennebec, State of Maine, on which bids will be received until the time specified in the "Notice to Contractors" do(es) hereby bid and offer to enter into this contract to supply all the materials, tools, equipment and labor to construct the whole of the Work in strict accordance with the terms and conditions of this Contract at the unit prices in the attached "Schedule of Items."

The Offeror agrees to perform the work required at the price specified above and in accordance with the bids provided in the attached "Schedule of Items" in strict accordance with the terms of this solicitation, and to provide the appropriate insurance and bonds if this offer is accepted by the Government in writing.

## As Offeror also agrees:

First: To do any extra work, not covered by the attached "Schedule of Items," which may be ordered by the Resident, and to accept as full compensation the amount determined upon a "Force Account" basis as provided in the *Standard Specifications*, *March 2020 Edition*, and as addressed in the contract documents.

Second: That the bid bond at 5% of the bid amount or the official bank check, cashier's check, certificate of deposit or U. S. Postal Money Order in the amount given in the "Notice to Contractors", payable to the Treasurer of the State of Maine and accompanying this bid, shall be forfeited, as liquidated damages, if in case this bid is accepted, and the undersigned shall fail to abide by the terms and conditions of the offer and fail to furnish satisfactory insurance and Contract bonds under the conditions stipulated in the Specifications within 15 days of notice of intent to award the contract.

Third: To begin the Work as stated in Section 107.2 of the *Standard Specifications March 2020 Edition* and complete the Work within the time limits given in the Special Provisions of this Contract.

Fourth: The Contractor will be bound to the Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Requirements contained in the attached Notice (Additional Instructions to Bidders) and submit a completed Contractor's Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Utilization Plan with their bid.

Fifth: That this offer shall remain open for 30 calendar days after the date of opening of bids.

Sixth: The Bidder hereby certifies, to the best of its knowledge and belief that: the Bidder has not, either directly or indirectly, entered into any agreement, participated in any collusion, or otherwise taken any action in restraint of competitive bidding in connection with its bid, and its subsequent contract with the Department.

#### 202.2023 - Removing Pavement Surface - Medum Cut Drum

Shall be used to remove pavement from roadway and bridges at the following locations and depths.

Transitions into and out of bridge joints will be paid under this item. (202.2023)

## 2 inch cut will be milled from the following stations:

- 1. Stations 99+55 111+00 and 217+00 221+05 full width including shoulders and ramps.
  - a. For the plunge cut operation, the Contractor can request the use of a traditional drum and to be paid under the 202.2023 item.

## <u>1 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch cut will be milled from the following locations:</u>

- 1. Carter Memorial Bridge (Stations 137+17 152+43)
  - a. Travel Lanes and Shoulders
  - b. The right Shoulder has a parabolic shoulder that will need to be match to match into the Concrete Bridge header. (As seen in Typical Section 4 of 7
- 2. Abenaki Bridge (Stations 405+79 409+05)
  - a. Travel Lanes and Shoulders

The contractor is responsible for conducting core tests on the bridges to verify pavement depth, prior to milling operations.

#### 2 inch plunge cut will be removed from the following stations:

1. Stations 110+00 - 132+17. Main line travel way and turn lane only. Left and Right sides.

Other areas may be milled as directed by the Department.

Millings/grindings will become property of the State of Maine and will be delivered and stockpiled at the MDOT, 109 Lyons Road, Sidney, ME 04330 Maintenance Camp in Sidney. Payment for delivery and stockpiling will be incidental to Item 202.2023. Stockpiling shall include all equipment, personnel, and all other necessary incidentals required to construct stockpiles as per normal construction practices

(Contract Time – Working Days)

This Contract shall be completed within <u>55</u> working days. The Contractor may begin work anytime on or after <u>April 15, 2024</u>, in accordance with Standard Specification 104.4.2 and upon approval of all required submittals. Time charge will commence on the start date or no later than <u>June 2</u>, <u>2025</u>, whichever occurs first.

At least 21 calendar days prior to the desired Begin Construction Date and no later than May 12<sup>th</sup>, the Contractor shall submit an electronic copy of their signed request to begin work and the Begin Construction Date. This signed request shall be sent read receipt through email with their Schedule of Work, in accordance with Standard Specification 107.4.2, to Shawn.Smith@Maine.gov, Kyle.MacDonald@Maine.gov and Scott.Bickford@Maine.gov. The Contractor shall notify all utility contacts listed in the 104 Special Provision and provide the utility contacts the submitted schedule of work within 2 calendar days of the schedule of work submittal. A penalty in the amount of \$500/day will be assessed for each calendar day or partial calendar day beyond May 12<sup>th</sup> that the schedule of work is not received. Upon receipt of the schedule of work, a pre-construction meeting will be scheduled.

The Contractor may request to adjust the submitted schedule of work and Begin Construction Date once after the initial submittal. The Department will allow adjustments in the Begin Construction Date of up to <u>seven calendar days</u> if the request is made at least <u>21 calendar days</u> prior to the updated Begin Construction Date. This signed request shall be sent read receipt through <u>email</u> with their <u>Schedule of Work</u>, in accordance with Standard Specification 107.4.2, to <u>Shawn.Smith@Maine.gov</u>, <u>Kyle.MacDonald@Maine.gov</u> and <u>Scott.Bickford@Maine.gov</u>. The Contractor shall notify all utility contacts listed in the 104 Special Provision and provide the utility contacts the updated schedule of work within 2 calendar days of the request to adjust the Begin Construction Date.

The Contractor shall stop all work and have all lanes open and in a safe operating condition to traffic on the following dates:

- Friday, May 23, 2025, at 12:00 pm (noontime) until Tuesday, May 27, 2025, at 6:00 am due to Memorial Day.
- Thursday, July 3, 2025, at 12:00 pm (noontime) until Sunday, July 6, 2025, at 6:00 pm due to Independence Day.
- Friday, August 29, 2025, at 12:00 pm (noontime) until Tuesday, September 2, 2025, at 6:00 am due to Labor Day.
