The following questions have been received:

Question: Who provided the services last year? If it was a contractor what was the contract amount by location?

Response: These services were not performed under a contract.

Question: Does contractor need to clean area after the docks are removed from the paved area? Examples I'm talking about are seaweed, barnacles, etc.

Response: Yes.

Question: Does contractor need to weed wack around base of all trees?

Response: Yes.

Question: Can any mowing and/or weed wacking be done on Saturdays or Sundays?

Response: No, work is not allowed on weekends or State recognized holidays.

Question: Hancock Site-Does all of the area need to be mowed only once in spring and once in fall? If not, what is the area that needs to be mowed when grass is over 5 inches?

Response: No, when you pull into rest area, and your back is to Rte.1, the area on the right side is to be mowed in the spring cleanup and in the fall, **but** the walkways need to be kept clean of overhanging grasses, which will be string trimmed and walkways to be cleaned afterwards, swept or blown clean throughout the maintenance season. Area on the left needs to be mowed when over 5 inches and string trimmed.



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Question: Sullivan Overlook-How far beyond stone walkway needs to be mowed?

Response: Mid-way down the slope to allow for a clear view.

Question: Sullivan Long Cove Rest Area-Does contractor need to weed wack all wooded area or just path to picnic tables?

Response: Yes, all the area needs to be mowed and string trimmed if over 5 inches.
