

MAINE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION
DESCRIPTION OF STATE MAINTENANCE BOUNDARY LINES FOR

Biddeford, York County, Maine

Beginning at a point on South St (inventory road # 920) 0.46 miles west of River Road (inventory road # 891), reference utility pole #140; thence, easterly via the northerly right-of-way of South Street to the easterly right-of-way of I-95 (Maine Turnpike); thence, northerly via said right-of-way to the Biddeford-Saco Town Line in the Saco River; thence, easterly and southerly via said Town Line and river into the waters of Saco Bay; thence southeasterly following the shoreline around the peninsula and then westerly following the shoreline to a point due southeast of Beach Avenue; thence northwesterly along the south right of way of Beach Avenue and Bridge Road (SR #208) to just south of the Bridge Rd and Route 9 intersection.

Thence southerly along the north right of way of Route 9 (Pool Street) to the intersection with West Street; thence northwesterly to the intersection of Guinea Road and Proctor Road (inventory road # 846); thence, westerly to Elm Street (U.S. 1) at the Biddeford-Arundel Town Line; thence, northwesterly via said Town Line to the former Boston and Maine railroad line; thence, northerly to Alfred Road (State Route 111) at the entrance to the Maine Turnpike; thence, westerly along the southerly right of way of State Route 111 to the Biddeford -Alfred town line; thence, easterly along the northerly right of way of State Route 111 to the entrance to the Maine Turnpike; thence, northeasterly along the easterly right-of-way of I-95 (Maine Turnpike); to the intersection of South Street; thence, westerly along the southerly right of way of South St (inventory road # 920) to reference utility pole #140, the point of beginning.

NOTE: Bridges, if any, bisected by the State Maintenance Line are in the rural area.

*closed rural gaps on West St and Rt 208 totaling 2.5 miles by simplifying compact area around the Pool peninsula; also simplified area east of ME Turnpike between Route 111 and South Street
