ABANDONED BUILDINGS - PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT

To All Maine Code Officers and Fire Inspectors - A request for assistance in your communities:

In light of the recent tragedy involving three fatalities from a fire within an abandoned structure, the Fire Marshal's Office and Building Codes program would like to provide this letter regarding abandoned buildings. As a reminder, there are potential hazards that may exist in your respective communities relative to abandoned buildings, as they can become a nuisance, and if unsecured, allows entry for someone seeking shelter or other activities.

The intent of this notice is to raise awareness for the existence of these potential outcomes as you are the best boots on the ground to help avoid another tragic event. Please take a little time to review your records of any known abandoned buildings and consider taking a ride by to determine if any are not properly secured. This is simply a public service that we all strive to achieve in our duties to protect the safety of our fellow citizens. The importance of this effort will allow for the opportunity to notify the owners of the buildings of their responsibility to make their buildings safe, so that we may possibly avoid these unfortunate headlines in the future.
