I. Committee Reports

- A. Best Practices Committee No Report
- B. Professional Development Conference

Largest to date; most vendors. Actively looking for ways to add more vendors to the conference. There will be a June MFCA Conference in Bar Harbor with Chief Locke (speaker) and Chief Brillant discussing PFAs.

C. Education and Training Strategy Committee

Working with DAFS on transfer of money appropriately. Confirmed with vendor that facilities can be built by May 2026. Four inquiries for repairs on current facilities were made. Adjusted provision to future buildings: Must have live fire instructor on-site to oversee live burns. There was a discussion on a strategy to hold onto funds for future engineering reports vs. Funding additional builds. Confirmed that business plan is part of the application process (facilities are locally owned, not state-owned). Discussion on current usage of buildings and reinstating the responsibility of the municipality, including annual reports. Discussion on commissions role to enforce maintenance of buildings and correct live fire usage. Suggestion made to set up a Special Meeting with fire chiefs of current and future facilities.

D. Recruitment and Retention Committee

Penobscot County, 11 events, 100% support from fire departments and partnership with admissions. Five live ins joining the program. MaineWorks featured ad: Fire/EMS from Dexter Tri-County, licensed EMT/FF.

E. Wildland Fire Committee

Cheabeague Island submitted a grant through GOPIF to put together a community wildfire protection plan (first state program to use state funding to development this type of plan). MFS is hopeful for communities to put together their own plans for preparedness.

F. Staffing Committee

BRIC survey moving forward. Requests fire service participation.

G. Cancer Reduction Grant

Moving forward with awards process and collection of SOPs. Chair to confirm receipt of SOPs before awards are to be granted.
