
## ASSAULTS ON LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS


The following information is based on a detailed monthly collection of data in the Uniform Crime Reporting system regarding the problem of assaults on municipal, county and state law enforcement officers.

## During 2017:

- There were 170 assaults on law enforcement officers, an increase from the 2016 figure of 149.
- The ratio of assaults per 100 officers during 2017 was 7.4, compared to 6.5 assaults per 100 officers during 2016.
- The greatest number of officer assaults occurred while the officer was responding to disturbance calls 65, or 38.2% of the total.
- Personal weapons (hands, fists, feet, etc.) were used in 88.8% or 151 of the assaults.
- Of the 170 assaults, 24.1% (41) resulted in personal injury to the officer, while 75.9% (129) produced no injury.
- 43.5% of assaults were aimed at officers who were alone (74), 56.5% were directed at assisted officers (96).
- The most common time period of assaults was 8 p.m. to 2 a.m. (43.5%), with 17.6% occurring from 12 a.m. to 2 a.m.
- Law enforcement cleared 95.9% (163) of all assaults on officers.
- Of the 170 reported assaults on officers, 19 were on sheriff's deputies, 8 were on state police officers, and 143 were on municipal officers.
