# Sexual Assault Evidence Collection

#### Updated: Feb. 2025



## WHAT TO COLLECT:

In the event of a sexual assault, always collect the following when possible:

- Maine State Sex Crimes Kit from hospital
- Victim's clothing, worn at the time of the assault
- Victim's bedding (if location of assault) \*
- Any items possibly involved in assault (as indicated by victim's statement)

\*NOTE: If assault occurred on suspect's bedding, only collect if looking for <u>victim's blood</u>

## HOW WILL I GET RESULTS?

A Forensic Chemist will issue a report containing the results of body fluid testing. Reports will be emailed to the primary investigator.

### WHAT ABOUT DNA?

Items positive for relevant body fluids will be sent on for DNA analysis<u>after</u> Forensic Chemistry examinations are complete. <u>A separate report containing DNA</u> results will be issued.



# FABRIC COLLECTION

Tips for collecting and preserving fabric evidence:

Ex. Clothing, bedding, carpets, curtains, etc.

- Do <u>not</u> swab fabric collect entire item or take cuttings
- Photograph before handling
- <u>AIR DRY</u> before packaging in <u>paper</u>
- Package each item separately
- Label each item with a description and identify the wearer, if applicable
- If submitting a cutting, identify location cutting was taken from
