CALL TO ORDER

Chair Rumsey called the meeting to order at 0913.

Because of the storm on December 18, 2023, there was only emergency lighting in the building. The meeting was held in Room 246, which had windows that offered substantial natural light. The electrical outlets were not working and there was no Wifi, so members had no access to electronic files.

INFORMAL CONFERENCES

On a motion by Russell second by Stark, the CRC voted unanimously to go into executive session pursuant to 1 M.R.S. § 405(6)(F) for the purpose of discussing information pertaining to allegations of certificate holder misconduct, which information and records are expressly made confidential under 25 M.R.S. § 2806-A(10).

The CRC went into executive session at 0914 and conducted an investigative interview in one case and held informal conferences in the following cases:

The CRC then discussed open cases.

The CRC came out of executive session at 1455 and voted on case recommendations.

CASE RECOMMENDATIONS

Case No. 2023-060 On a motion by Russell seconded by Love, the CRC voted 4-0 to present this case to the Board and recommend that the Board grant a waiver to this BLETP candidate for an OUI conviction.

Case No. 2023-061 On a motion by Stark seconded by Russell, the CRC voted 4-0 to present this case to the Board and recommend that the Board grant a waiver to this BLETP candidate for an OUI conviction, drug use, and failing to report income on taxes.

Case No. 2023-062 On a motion by Stark seconded by Russell, the CRC voted 4-0 to present this case to the Board and recommend that the Board grant a waiver to this BLETP candidate for the illegal use of scheduled drugs.

Case No. 2023-057 On a motion by Russell seconded by Love, the CRC voted 4-0 to present this case to the Board and recommend that the Board offer a consent agreement to this law enforcement officer convicted of OUI. The consent agreement that would impose a 3-year period of probation.
