CALL TO ORDER

Chair Rumsey called the meeting to order at 0908.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The proposed minutes for the CRC Meeting of August 15, 2024, were reviewed and on a motion by Stark seconded by Rumsey were approved by a vote of 2 in favor, 0 opposed, and 2 abstained (King and Kamorski).

INFORMAL CONFERENCES

On a motion by King second by Stark, the CRC voted unanimously to go into executive session pursuant to 1 M.R.S. § 405(6)(F) for the purpose of discussing information pertaining to allegations of certificate holder misconduct, which information and records are expressly made confidential under 25 M.R.S. § 2806-A(10).

The CRC went into executive session at 0910 and held informal conferences in the following cases:

The CRC recessed for lunch from 1126 until 1212. The CRC then held informal conferences in the following cases:

The CRC then discussed open cases.

The CRC came out of executive session at 1441 and voted on case recommendations.

CASE RECOMMENDATIONS

Case No. 2024-048 On a motion by King seconded by Stark, the CRC voted 4-0 to present this case to the Board and recommend that the Board grant a waiver to this BLETP applicant for having engaged in conduct constituting the Class D crimes of theft and unlawful possession of scheduled drugs.

Case No. 2024-051 On a motion by Stark seconded by King, the CRC voted 4-0 to present this case to the Board and recommend that the Board deny a waiver to this BLETP applicant for having engaged in conduct constituting the Class D crime domestic violence assault.

Case No. 2024-052 On a motion by King seconded by Stark, the CRC voted 3 in favor, 0 opposed and 1 recused (Kamorski) to present this case to the Board and recommend that the Board to offer a consent agreement to this BLETP applicant that would place him on probation for 3 years and grant a waiver for having engaged in conduct constituting the Class D crimes of unsworn falsification and unlawful possession of scheduled drugs.

Case No. 2023-010 On a motion by King seconded by Stark, the CRC voted 4-0 to present this case to the Board and recommend that the Board summarily revoke the certificate of eligibility of this law enforcement officer for being convicted of a Class B crime.

Case No. 2024-006 On a motion by Stark seconded by Kamorski, the CRC voted 4-0 to present this case to the Board and recommend that the Board revoke the certificate of eligibility of this corrections officer for engaging in conduct constituting the Class D crime of domestic violence assault.

Case No. 2024-037 On a motion by Kamorski seconded by King, the CRC voted 4-0 to present this case to the Board and recommend that the Board offer this corrections officer a consent agreement that would place him on probation for 3 years for pleading guilty pursuant to the deferred disposition of the Class D crime of OUI.

Case No. 2024-042 On a motion by Rumsey seconded by King, the CRC voted 4-0 to present this case to the Board and recommend that the Board dismiss this case against this corrections officer but issue a letter of guidance emphasizing the importance of obeying all laws.

Case No. 2024-045 On a motion by King seconded by Rumsey, the CRC voted 4-0 to present this case to the Board and recommend that the Board take no further action in this case involving a corrections officer.

ADJOURN

There being no further business, on a motion by Stark seconded by King, the CRC voted 4-0 to adjourn at 1449.
