Dear Senator Beebe-Center, Representative Hasenfus, and Committee Members,

On behalf of the Board of Trustees of the Maine Criminal Justice Academy, we are pleased to present the 2025 MCJA annual report to your committee. This report, prepared and submitted on behalf of the Board by the hard-working staff at MCJA, is intended to satisfy the statutory requirement for its production, but just as importantly, to be informative to your committee and other interested parties about the work of the Academy. I am sure that this report will convince you and your fellow legislators that appropriate and timely training is being completed at the Academy, that our team is attentive and responsive to the people of the State of Maine, and that we are committed to transparency and accountability.

The Board is comprised of 19 members including those from law enforcement and corrections, citizen representatives, an educator, and legal representatives. This dedicated group remains committed to protecting the public health and welfare, by ensuring that the public is served by competent and honest criminal justice practitioners and by establishing minimum standards of proficiency. We have accomplished these goals by holding regularly scheduled public meetings throughout the year.

During the past year, the Board and MCJA staff continued the process of codifying Academy policy standards and training specifications through the administrative rulemaking process. We also completed numerous updates to our minimum policy standards in response to statutory changes and emerging best practices. As you may know, once our minimum policy standards are updated, the Maine Chiefs of Police Association uses them to update their model polices. These minimum standards and model policies are shared with every law enforcement agency in Maine, which must certify annually that they have adopted the standards.

2025 was no exception to the rule that for years, we have asked too much of the small staff of training coordinators, administrative professionals and leadership at the Academy. Over the past 30 years, the number of full-time employees at the Academy has been reduced dramatically, and the workload has increased. This report tells the tale of their efforts to provide exceptional training, manage the certification (and when necessary, decertification) of our state's corrections, law enforcement, and probation and parole officers, and comply with legislative mandates. As long as I am privileged to serve as Chair of the Board, I will continue advocating for proper funding for MCJA's staff and the maintenance of our facility.

We understand the legislative process but also appreciate the opportunity to engage in dialog with legislators and the people of Maine to address concerns with necessary training, accountability, and procedural best practice. We have found that frequently, we are able to be nimble in our response to

satisfy these concerns without resorting to legislative mandate. We are ready, if you desire, to appear before the Committee to elaborate on any issue associated with this report or the Academy and its operation.

Senate Chair Beebe-Center, Representative Chair Hasenfus and distinguished Committee Members:

I would like to thank the Committee Chairs and Members for their work and support of the Academy over the last year.

In June of 2025, Director Jack D. Peck, Jr. left service with the Academy after having served as the Assistant Director from 2020 to 2023 and as the Director from 2023 to 2025. Director Peck moved to another position in state government in the Department of Education's Maine School Safety Center serving as a School Emergency Management Planner. Thankfully, his work there allows our staff to continue to collaborate with him in our School Resource Officer training program. As a result of Director Peck's departure, Commissioner of Public Safety Michael Sauschuck appointed me Academy Director with the advice and consent of the Board on June 24, 2025.

In August of 2025, Training Coordinator Joshua Daley was promoted to the vacant Assistant Director's position. Assistant Director Daley has served as an MCJA Training Coordinator since 2019 and has been assigned to manage the Basic Law Enforcement Training Program (BLETP), all use of force related instructional programs, and the Physical Fitness Testing Instructor course. Assistant Director Daley has been involved in instruction and / or course development for the BLETP, Basic Corrections Training Program, the new Basic Probation and Parole Training Program, and the Methods of Instruction course. He has also served as a use of force expert for force evaluations and has been a court recognized expert witness. Assistant Director Daley also serves as the MCJA Director's delegate to the State of Maine Deadly Force Review Committee and on the Deaf, Hard of Hearing, Late Deafened Advisory Committee working to improve training for first responders to better serve the industry and impacted community. Assistant Director Daley has advanced degrees including a Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice and a Master of Science in Criminal Justice Administration from Husson University. He is a graduate of the 29th Basic Law Enforcement Training Program in 2015 serving as class President and possesses numerous advanced training/certifications.

Assistant Director Daley's promotion created a vacancy in the corps of MCJA Training Coordinators and as a result, Mr. James Gioia was hired to fill the position. Training Coordinator Gioia distinguished himself in the field of eleven applicants as the most qualified applicant given his vast professional and

instructional experience. Mr. Gioia came to the Academy with 25 years of prior law enforcement experience having held many different positions in his law enforcement service with six different local, state, and federal law enforcement agencies. Mr. Gioia has substantial experience in investigations, ranging from lower-level offenses to high-level offenses such as homicide. Additionally, Mr. Gioia possesses vast experience as an instructor and facilitator having developed lesson plans, coordinated with Academy staff, worked with multiple agencies in the state, and instructed an array of topics in which he is considered a subject matter expert (SME). Mr. Gioia also holds several instructor and / or advanced certifications, including Methods of Instruction, Interactive Use of Force, Mechanics of Arrest/Restraint/Control, Force Science Analyst, Forensic Video Analysis, Homicide Investigations, and Interview and Interrogations. With the hiring of Mr. Gioia, the Academy is at full staff.

The Maine Criminal Justice Academy's Complaint Review Committee (CRC) continues to be very busy with reports of misconduct and requests for waivers with a 2025 caseload of 113 cases. These reviews are labor intensive, and we thank CRC Chair Major Jason King (Portland Police Department), Director of Investigations Anna Love (Office of the Attorney General), Supervisory Special Agent Eric Dos Santos (Office of the Inspector General), and our citizen representatives Lt Colonel Thomas DiTomasso (U.S. Army, Retired), Ms. Francine Garland-Stark for their work and dedication to this extremely challenging work.

In response to the increasing CRC workload and as a result of a budgeting initiative by Commissioner Sauschuck, an Academy paralegal position was added to the staff in 2025. The position was filled in January 2026 with the hire of Ms. Jen Coursey who previously served with the Office of the Attorney General Criminal Division and in the private sector as a paralegal for the past 7 years. Ms. Coursey holds a Bachelor of Arts in Communications with minors in Public Relations and Theatre from the University of Maine and also holds a Master of Science in Marketing Research & Data Analytics from Southern New Hampshire University. Ms. Coursey will assist in the management of CRC cases and process as well as management of FOAA requests for the Academy.

In May 2025, annual Board elections took place. Chief Charles "Chip" Rumsey (Cumberland Police Department) was re-elected Chair of the Board. Likewise, Deputy Police Chief David Bushey (Bangor Police Department) was re-elected Board Vice Chair and Corrections Unit Manager Mateo Mendoza (Maine Department of Corrections) was re-elected Board Secretary.

Two Basic Law Enforcement Training Programs (BLETP) were completed last year. The eighteen-week program trained and graduated 153 law enforcement professionals. The programs had 206 applicants and 171 cadets were eventually selected and started the two training programs. Every candidate was admitted into the programs. The BLETP classes were very diverse with several multi-language learners, forty-six military veterans, and twenty-four female graduates. Additionally, 41 cadets reported having attended some college, 24 had an Associate's degree, 50 had a Bachelor's degree, 4 had a Master's degree, and 1 had a Ph.D. or J.D.

The Academy, partnering with the Maine Department of Corrections and staff from the 15 county correctional facilities, also trained and graduated 205 correctional professionals from the 4 Basic Corrections Training Programs (BCTP). The BCTP is delivered in a hybrid format utilizing Zoom based remote and in-person instruction, including scenario-based training, and is delivered at 4 regional training sites: the Academy, Maine State Prison, Mountain View Correctional Center, and the Maine Correctional Center. Additionally, 28 students graduated from the 3 Juvenile Basic Corrections Training Programs held at the Long Creek Youth Development Center.

In 2025, Academy staff initiated rulemaking on behalf of the Board to create the Basic Probation and Parole Training Program (BPPTP) in Chapter 5: Training Standards and in Chapter 3: Entrance Standards. This work was required as a result of the enactment of LD 2045, “An Act to Establish Training and Certification Standards for Probation and Parole Officers” in the 131st Legislature. During rulemaking, additional updates were also made to the Basic Law Enforcement Training Program, Basic Corrections Training Program, and Juvenile Basic Corrections Training Program.

The Academy, which is located on over 100 acres in the Town of Vassalboro, has been undergoing some much-needed infrastructure and building upgrades. Almost eight million dollars has already been invested or designated to upgrade life safety, security and building renovations. As part of this work in 2025, renovations began in C-Building’s dormitory space with a refresh of the second floor, and complete refit of the third and fourth floors. In the initial renovations at the Academy in the early 2000’s, the fourth floor had never been finished, so this project will allow for expanded housing capacity. Also of note is that as part of this project, heat pumps will be installed in C-building which will provide air-conditioned dormitory space for students. This is the first time any dormitory space at the Academy will be air-conditioned and will be a welcome addition for our students.

Again, I want to thank the members of the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice and Public Safety for all the hard work you do and for your support of the Maine Criminal Justice Academy.

I would like to extend to your committee members on behalf of Academy staff and the Board of Trustees any assistance, advice, or guidance we can provide to help in your committee work as it relates to the Maine Criminal Justice Academy.

ABOUT THE ACADEMY

The origin of organized law enforcement training in Maine dates to the late 1960's when the Federal Law Enforcement Assistance Agency made funds available through the Maine Criminal Justice Planning and Assistance Agency for improving the operation of the criminal justice system. Using this as seed money, the Maine Municipal Association initiated a two-week law enforcement training program offered in the Portland, Augusta, and Bangor regions. A Board of Directors, consisting of law enforcement officials, was charged with overseeing the program and encouraging law enforcement agencies to support the training.

The early 1970's saw passage of the Mandatory Training Act for law enforcement and in 1972 the former Thomas College in Waterville was purchased to provide permanent facilities for the Maine Criminal Justice Academy. Since that time, the scope of activities at the Academy has steadily increased. In 1990, new legislation required that all law enforcement officers, state, county and municipal, who have the power of arrest and the authority to carry a firearm, come under the purview of the Academy's Board of Trustees. This has greatly increased the responsibilities and tasks of the Academy.

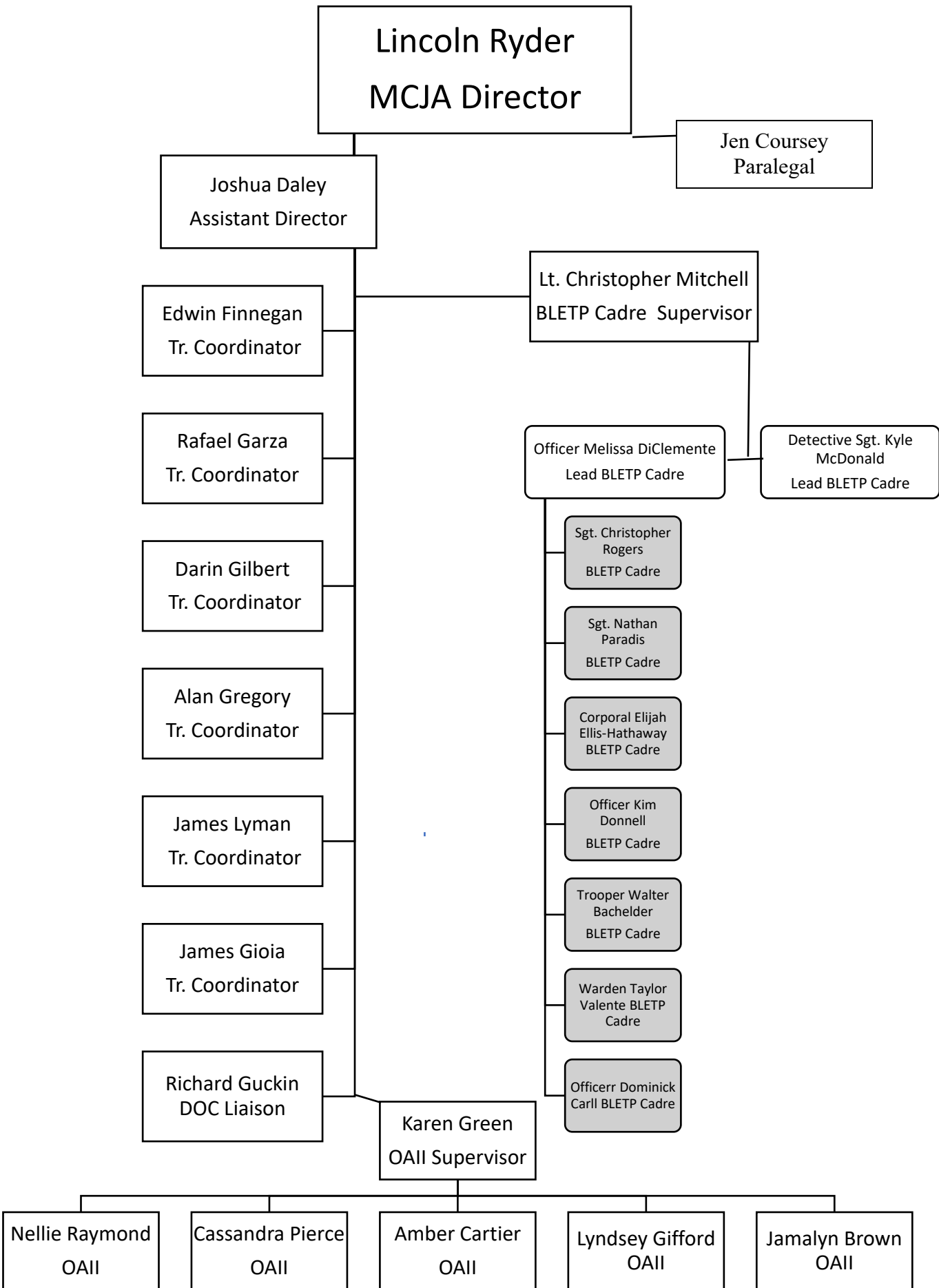
The Maine Criminal Justice Academy is responsible for the development and implementation of comprehensive training programs both at the Academy and through outreach programs across the state.



With this responsibility the Academy is providing:

1. A residential training facility to accommodate the needs of Maine's criminal justice professionals.
2. A training delivery system to reach all parts of the State.
3. A centralized administrative structure which promotes coordination and communication; and
4. A repository of support services that promotes research, management, and training activities of all types.

The citizens of Maine have a reasonable expectation that extensive training is provided to criminal justice personnel, particularly those responsible for dealing with emergency situations, which could involve life and death decisions. Court decisions have held that it is the responsibility of criminal justice agencies to ensure that their personnel receive training, which supports the quality performance these citizens expect and deserve. At present, the Maine Criminal Justice Academy is the primary vehicle for Maine criminal justice agencies to meet these obligations.



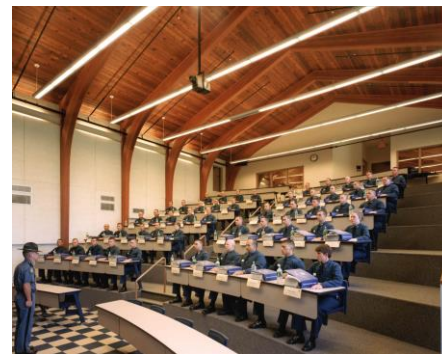
SUMMARY OF TRAINING ACTIVITIES FOR 2025

LAW ENFORCEMENT TRAINING

Basic Law Enforcement Training

The basic training for law enforcement officers for the calendar year 2025 consists of the following:

- 2 Basic Law Enforcement Training Programs (720 hours) for 153 students.
- 8 Pre-Service Law Enforcement Courses – Phase I (40 hours), Phase II (80 hours) and Phase III (80 hours) for 137 students.



The 2025 mandatory in-service training requirements for all law enforcement officers were:

- Two (2) hours of MCJA Firearms Qualification
- Two (2) hours of New Law/Case Law Updates
- Two (2) hours of Trauma-Informed Training for Law Enforcement Officers
- Two (2) hours of Officer Wellness
- Four (4) hours of Mechanics of Arrest, Restraint, and Control refresher in-person practical (Block 3 of the MARC manual)
- Twenty (20) hours of elective training approved by the chief administrative officer of the agency which will be completed between January 1, 2024 and December 31, 2025 (a two-year cycle).

CORRECTIONS TRAINING

Basic Corrections (Adult and Juvenile) Training

The basic training for corrections officers for the calendar year 2025 consists of the following:

- 4 Basic Corrections Training Programs (228.5 hours) for 205 students.
- 3 Juvenile Basic Corrections Training Program (217 hours) for 28 students.

The 2025 mandatory in-service training requirements for correctional officers were:

- New Law Updates
- Use of Force - using either BCTP or JBCTP curriculum.
- Building an Inclusive Culture - (BCTP curriculum)
- Developmental Disabilities & Disabled Inmates / Residents - (BCTP curriculum)

PROBATION AND PAROLE TRAINING

Basic Probation and Parole Training

The 2025 mandatory in-service training requirements for Probation Officers were:

- New Law Updates
- Mechanics of Arrest, Restraint, and Control refresher in-person practical
- Firearms
- Case Management
- DOC or Regional Choice: Professionalism & Ethics

IN-SERVICE TRAINING

The Academy conducted more than 216,953 hours of in-service and mandated training programs (corrections and law enforcement) to more than 3195 officers throughout the state. This training was conducted using a combination of in-person, virtual, or web-based training.

SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1976 - Municipal School increases from a ten-week program to twelve weeks. Regional law enforcement in-service training implemented.

1977 - Dispatcher training curriculum developed.

1978 - Basic Corrections Training Course developed. A system of reporting by corrections agencies is added to law enforcement reporting. Instructor Certification Program implemented. The Methods of Instruction Course are developed.

1979 - Regional training certification by the Board of Trustees initiated. Supervision, Mid-Management, and Executive Development courses implemented. Arson investigation, team concept, developed. Reserve Officer Training curriculum and standards developed as directed by the Legislature.

1980 - Mandatory in-service training for corrections officers takes effect. Advanced Arson Investigation curriculum developed. Domestic Violence Course developed. Law Enforcement Task Analysis initiated.

1981 - Radar Operator's Course developed. Highway Safety film collection catalogued, maintained, and circulated. Specialized Instructor Certification program initiated. Intermediate and Advanced Officer Certification implemented. Firearms Instructor Course developed. Intoxilyzer Operator Certification initiated.

1982 - Final report on the Law Enforcement Task Analysis is completed. Municipal/County Basic Police School curriculum revised. Emergency Vehicle Operator's Course developed.

1983 - Training for part-time and reserve police officers is mandated by the Legislature. A statewide survey to identify all part-time police officers is completed. Verification and suspension procedures for the certification of police officers were initiated.

1984 - The Honeywell computer system is installed. Basic Warden School is established at the Academy. Court Security Course developed. ALERT Test required as entrance standard for police officers. Canine Handlers Course developed. Certificates of Eligibility required of all police officers. A Task Analysis for Corrections Officers is initiated.

1985 - Academy responsible for administration of Justice Assistance Act funds for Maine. Background investigation manual.

1986 - Technical Assistance Program for small law enforcement agencies is initiated. Municipal Ordinance Prosecutor's Course developed.

1987 - Report on the Academy published by the Academy Review Committee. Basic Training for public safety dispatchers initiated. Entry level Corrections Officers Task Analysis published.

1988 - Semi-Automatic Weapons training initiated. Academy auditorium renovated. Recommended Physical Fitness Standards published. Terminal Operators Certification. All-Points Bulletin established. Advisory Committee on Corrections established. Drug Abuse Resistance Education (D.A.R.E.) instructor program.

1989 - Law Enforcement Officers Manual standardized. New Basic Corrections Training Curriculum established. New Standardized Field Sobriety Test developed. Oak-Grove Coburn purchased. Statewide State Law Enforcement Task Analyses completed.

1990 - Pre-Service Training Curriculum established. Statewide Regional In-Service Training Plan adopted. State Law Enforcement Training Curriculum adopted. Certification Test instituted.

1991 - Drug Recognition Technicians certified. D.A.R.E. officers trained with Maine mentors. Community Police Strategies developed. Provided technical assistance for business crime prevention projects.

1992 - New Decertification standards. Civil Rights training for all Law Enforcement agencies. Bloodborne Pathogens training for trainers. A.G. Task Force Report on the use of force.

1993 - Law Enforcement Agency Profile Survey conducted a joint effort MCJA/UMO Graduate Program. Total Quality Management training was initiated.

1994 - Added two citizen positions to the Board, bringing the Board membership to 17 members. Extended employment probationary period to one year after graduation from the basic law enforcement course. Increased the minimum age requirement for entry into the Municipal/County Basic Police School to 21 years of age, or 20 years of age if the applicant has an associate degree or 60 hours of post-secondary education. Upgraded computer networking capabilities to include regional offices.

1995 - The Board established minimum physical fitness and academic standards for all officers entering the Municipal/County Basic Police School. The Board also developed eight minimum policy and procedure standards that were distributed to all law enforcement agencies in order for them to submit to the Board the adopted final policies, as required by legislation. Also, effective January 1, 1996, each law enforcement agency was required to report to the Academy all excessive use of force complaints and the disposition of those complaints. A report from the Board was submitted to the Criminal Justice Committee recommending the implementation of joint training of Municipal, County and State Police. The program recommendations to the Board of Trustees for revision of the curriculum was completed for the new joint basic law enforcement training program.

1996 - Academy received a federal grant to strengthen community policing in Maine by effectively responding to domestic violence cases.

1997 - Governor Angus King submitted a \$10 million bond package to the Appropriations Committee for the renovation or construction of a new Criminal Justice Academy.

1998 - The Legislature appropriated \$11,271,203 to renovate the former Oak-Grove Coburn school and construct a specialized training facility.

1999 - The Maine Criminal Justice Academy Board of Trustees, following a recommendation from the Law Enforcement Advisory Committee established mandatory annual in-service training requirements for the year 2000. The Board of Trustees is also working to establish entrance standards for the combined Law Enforcement Basic Training Course and the entrance requirements for tuition students.

2000 - The Maine Criminal Justice Academy's staff and programs moved to a new facility in Vassalboro, Maine. This was also the first year that all law enforcement officers were required to complete mandatory in-service refresher training.

2001 - During this year the 1st Basic Law Enforcement Training Program involving eighteen weeks of training that combined state, county and municipal law enforcement officers was implemented at the new Maine Criminal Justice Academy's facility in Vassalboro, Maine.

2003 - The Academy accepted the first two tuition students into the Basic Law Enforcement Training Program. The Academy also applied for and received a federal grant to conduct a Job & Task Analysis of the Basic Law Enforcement Training Program to update the curriculum.

2004 - The Academy completed a Job & Task Analysis of the Basic Law Enforcement Training Program. New Goals and Objectives were identified and implemented.

2005 - The Academy offered nine courses “*on-line*” to assist agencies in complying with Board mandated training for law enforcement officers. More than 7,500 courses were completed on-line saving agencies tens of thousands of dollars in officer overtime, travel and replacement costs.

2007 – The Academy entered into a partnership with Northeast Counterdrug Training Center out of Pennsylvania to put on tuition free training in Maine for topics such as: Interview and Interrogation, Identifying Deceptive Behavior, Leadership and Mastering Performance, School Resource Officer, Advance School Resource Officer, Video Surveillance Techniques and other management type courses. This partnership should continue for many years.

2007 – The Academy closed the Southern Maine office, which was located at the Southern Maine Community College in South Portland.

2008 – The Academy had a 3rd parking lot constructed adjacent to Building A which can hold another 57 vehicles.

2009 – The Academy was allowed to hire Kate Faragher Houghton as a contract curriculum writer. The focus will be on the new Law Enforcement Preservice Program. The Academy was also able to contract with 2 agencies for full-time Cadre for the Basic Law Enforcement Training Program (BLETP). These contract Cadre positions are for a 2-year period and designed to give Cadets consistent training from BLETP class to BLETP class.

2011 – The Academy received a federal grant to replace the 20+ year old records management system. Informa, Inc. was selected, which will allow for more accurate information to be entered, online registration for training classes and for all criminal justice agencies in Maine to enter their own training records. The Academy closed the library and reopened it as a student lounge. The MCJA Student Benefit Fund purchased furniture, LCD projector, Blue Ray DVD player, surround sound system and a gaming port for the LCD projector.

2022 – A project to develop a strategic plan for the Academy was undertaken by the Department of Public Safety collaborating with Slalom, a management consulting company. The project sought to evaluate the training model, staffing, future capacity, budget, curriculum, building and technology needs, and the services provided by the Academy. The resulting work would yield a strategic plan and an overall vision for the Academy for the next five years and would be finalized in 2023.

2023 -- In February, Director Rick Desjardins left service with the Academy to take post as the Director of the Maine Drug Enforcement Agency. In March, Assistant Director Jack D. Peck, Jr. was appointed by the Board and the Commissioner of Public Safety as the new Director. In June, the Strategic Plan, which had been initiated in 2022, was finalized and implemented. Accordingly, pursuant to recommendations of the plan and through budgeting initiatives by Commissioner Michael Sauschuck, the Academy was authorized to add staff for the first time in approximately 20 years, authorizing the hiring of a Training Coordinator and two Office Associate II positions.

2024 – Two Office Associate IIs and one Training Coordinator were hired in March 2024 pursuant to the Commissioner Sauschuck’s 2023 budgeting initiatives. Additionally, the Department of Public Safety / Academy applied for and received \$500,000 in grant funding from the FY24 Safer Outcomes: Enhancing De-Escalation and Crisis Response Training for Law Enforcement – Curriculum Integration for Law Enforcement Academies and State-Level Training Commissions under the “Academy Path”. The grant supports the integration of de-escalation and crisis response concepts throughout recruit-level training academies, focusing on the following areas:

1. De-escalation tactics and alternatives to use of force.
2. Safely responding to an individual experiencing mental or behavioral health or suicidal crisis
3. Safe encounters with individuals with disabilities
4. Successfully participating on a crisis intervention team

5. Making referrals to community-based services and support

Funding will be used to conduct a current Job Task Analysis (JTA) with Maine's full-time law enforcement officers (last conducted in 2004) to assist in updating the Basic Law Enforcement Training Program (BLETP) curriculum. Additionally, a new curriculum in de-escalation and crisis response will be developed for integration into the BLETP. The work will be conducted through a project manager, a selected vendor for the JTA and curriculum development, and a specially trained cadre of subject matter experts (SMEs) selected from Maine's law enforcement agencies.

addition will increase housing in the building as 4th floor had been previously unfinished.

2025 – The Board engaged in rulemaking during the year updating both Chapter 3: Entrance Standards and Chapter 5: Training Standards. These changes removed the requirement of the outdated ALERT test for Law Enforcement candidates which had been used for the previous 41 years in lieu of a reading and writing standards necessary for course completion as determined by the hiring agency during their screening process. Rulemaking also updated portions of the BLETP, BCTP, and JBCTP programs and created the Basic Probation and Parole Training Program (BPPTP) as a result of LD 2045 in the 131st Legislature, bring probation and parole officers under the authority of the Academy.

In June of 2025, Director Jack D. Peck, Jr. left service with the Academy after having served as the Assistant Director from 2020 to 2023 and as the Director from 2023 to 2025. Assistant Director Lincoln Ryder was appointed Director by Commissioner of Public Safety Michael Sauschuck with the advice and consent of the Board on June 24, 2025.

In response to the increasing CRC workload and as a result of a budgeting initiative by Commissioner Sauschuck, an Academy paralegal position was added to the staff in 2025. The position was filled in January 2026.

Renovations began in C-Building at the Academy with a planned completion in 2026. This work is limited to the dormitory space on 2nd floor (refresh), and a complete refit of the 3rd and 4th floors. The

Senator Beebe-Center, Representative Hasenfus and Committee Members:

On July 2, 2015, Chapter 307 Public Law (L.D.25 and now 25 M.R.S. §4501) “An Act to Regulate Domestic Unmanned Aerial Vehicle Use” was enacted. This new law requires the Maine Criminal Justice Academy Board of Trustees to develop the mandatory standards for a policy, if a law enforcement agency chooses to use an Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (Drone) for law enforcement purposes. The Board adopted the Minimum Standards on March 10, 2017. This law also requires these agencies to report their use to the Commissioner of Public Safety each year. The agencies report their UAV use to the Academy with their annual reporting requirements, as outlined in 25 M.R.S., Chapter 341. The Academy, on behalf of the Commissioner, reports the following information to the Legislature as part of Chapter 307 Public Law in this annual report to include: a summary description of the number of deployments for investigative purposes, the general nature of those investigations, the number of search warrants sought, and the number of search warrants obtained for the deployment of unmanned aerial vehicles.

There are 147 law enforcement agencies in the State of Maine and each chief executive officer must file an annual report to the Academy. For 2025, only 38 agencies reported that they had a UAV, and all 38 agencies reported that they had a policy in place that met the MCJA Board Minimum Standards. Please see UAV APPENDIX 1 for additional statistics and summaries of deployments.

Senator Beebe-Center, Representative Hasenfus and Committee Members:

On April 27, 2015, Senator Rosen, Representative Warren, and Committee Members wrote a letter directing the Maine Criminal Justice Academy Board to adopt a new standard to the mandatory policy on “Response to Mental Illness and Involuntary Commitment Policy” with the standard that states:

The policy shall require that 20% of all full-time law enforcement officers of each agency receive at least 8 hours of nationally recognized or best practice in-person training in Mental Health Identification Awareness for Law Enforcement Officers by January 1, 2018 and that the agency maintains at least 20% after that date. The training standard requirement will be sent annually to the Maine Criminal Justice Academy as part of the annual reporting requirements, as outlined in 25 M.R.S. §2805-B. This was adopted by the Board on November 17, 2017. The 8 hours of training was also incorporated as a part of the Basic Law Enforcement Training Program curriculum, so all full-time law enforcement officers have received this training since August 1, 2015.

There are 147 law enforcement agencies in Maine; *4 agencies are exempt because they only have part-time law enforcement officers.* Each agency was sent a reporting form at the end of 2025 asking two questions. First, does your agency meet at least the 20% training requirement as stated above? Second, if not, what percentage have they met? All 143 full-time law enforcement agencies responded pursuant to 25 M.R.S. §2805-B and all but one (99.3%) of law enforcement agencies with at least 1 full-time law enforcement officer met this training requirement. NOTE: The one agency not in compliance had only one officer and that officer who was not trained at the time of reporting; in this case, five days prior to the reporting period ending on December 31, 2025, a second full-time officer who was properly trained to meet the standard resigned, bringing this agency from 50% of officers trained to 0% at the time of reporting.

Sauschuck of the Maine Department of Public Safety, I want to thank the members of the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice and Public Safety for all the hard work you do and for your continued support of the Maine Department of Public Safety and the Maine Criminal Justice Academy.

The Maine Forest Service provided a total of 10,264.9hrs of In-Service mission related training for its 61 sworn members of the agency in the year of 2025. The total training hours for the year resulted in an average of 168.3hrs of training per officer currently within the agency.

Broken into the two general training categories of Law Enforcement and all other In-Service training types, results in the following breakdown of hours. (See LE detailed breakdown below)
