RESOLUTION 4 DIRECTOR AUTHORITY TO ENTER INTO INTERIM CONSENT AGREEMENTS FOR INDIVIDUALS FACING CRIMINAL PROSECUTION

Expiration Date:

November 17, 2026 (unless rescinded earlier)

Preamble:

Under its enabling statute the Board is authorized to delegate its powers to the director. The relevant provisions pertaining to the proposed delegation are as follows (emphasis added):

8 M.R.S. §1003. POWERS AND DUTIES OF BOARD

- 1. **Powers**. In administering and enforcing this chapter, the board or *the director*, as delegated by the board, may: ...
 - G. Pursuant to subchapter 5, *deny any application* and limit, restrict, suspend or revoke any license, registration or approval under this chapter; ...
 - J. Negotiate consent agreements to resolve administrative violations or investigations;

8 M.R.S. §1051. DISCIPLINARY SANCTIONS

3. **Further action**. If the board or its designee finds after notice pursuant to subsection 2 that the factual basis of the complaint is true and is of sufficient gravity to warrant further action, it may take any of the following actions.

A. The board or its designee may enter into a consent agreement with the consent of the licensee that establishes the period and terms of probation necessary to protect the public health and safety and to rehabilitate or educate the licensee. A consent agreement may be used to terminate a complaint investigation if a consent agreement is entered into by the board, the licensee and the Attorney General.

Resolve:

The director may enter into a consent agreement that suspends a license upon receipt of any credible information pertaining to allegations of criminal activity that could result in a conviction that would disqualify the licensee form holding a license. The period of suspension will last until the criminal matter is adjudicated or dismissed. The consent agreement will be a non-disciplinary administrative consent agreement. If the licensee is ultimately convicted of a crime affecting eligibility then the matter

| will be scheduled for hearing prior to any reinstatement of licensure. If the licensee is acquitted, |

| convicted of a crime not affecting eligibility, or the case is dismissed then the license is automatically |
| reinstated. A monthly report will be sent to the Gambling Control board whenever this resolution is |
| utilized. |
