
BRIGADIER GENERAL ROBERT G. CARMICHAEL

Assistant Adjutant General-Army, Maine Army National Guard



Brigadier General Robert G. Carmichael assumed his duties as the Assistant Adjutant General-Army, Maine Army National Guard on 1 April, 2004. His civilian occupation is as a Vice President of Human Resources and Training Development at Maine Savings Federal Credit Union in Hampden, Maine. Brigadier General Carmichael was commissioned as an Infantry Branch 2d Lieutenant from the Army ROTC program at the University of Maine at Orono on 26 May 1979. Subsequently, he entered active duty in January 1980 as a student at the Infantry Officer Basic Course at Fort Benning, Georgia followed by attendance at helicopter Flight School in June 1980. Brigadier General Carmichael's first assignment was with the 101st Aviation Group of the 101st Airborne Division where he participated in Operation Urgent Fury in Grenada in October 1983. In May 1984 he returned to Fort Benning to attend the Infantry Officer Advance Course. Brigadier General Carmichael left active duty in 1985 and joined the Maine Army National Guard (MEARNG) in May 1986. In 1989, he returned to active

duty as an AGR officer with the MEARNG where he served until his retirement March 2004. Brigadier General Carmichael's previous MEARNG assignments include Platoon Leader and Flight Operations Officer, 112th Air Ambulance Company; Commander, C/192 Aviation Company; Assistant S-3, 52d Troop Command; Military Support Officer and Organizational Effectiveness Officer, HHD, STARC; XO, 286th Support Battalion; XO, 52d Troop Command; and Director of Operations and Chief of Staff, HQ, STARC.
