

MAJOR GENERAL JOSEPH E. TINKHAM, II The Adjutant General, Maine



Major General Joseph E. Tinkham, II assumed duties as Adjutant General/Commissioner, on April 30, 2000. As Adjutant General/Commissioner he is directly in charge of the Maine Department of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management, which encompasses the Maine National Guard, Maine Emergency Management Agency and the Bureau of Veterans' Services. He is responsible to the Governor of Maine/Commander in Chief for the proper performance of duties. The Department of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management coordinates and administers the discharge of the Maine state government's responsibility relating to military matters, veterans, and civil emergency preparedness. It is responsible for the federal recognition and continuation of the federal forces structure, manpower, maintenance, fiscal operation and overall readiness of the Maine National Guard which is composed of over 3400 troops.

The General's military service began in 1966 when he was drafted into the active service. He was commissioned a Field Artillery officer following graduation from Active Component Officer Candidate School in 1967. Following commissioning he served in the Federal Republic of Germany and the 1st Cavalry Division, Republic of Vietnam. Leaving active duty with the rank of Captain he joined the Maine Army National Guard in 1973 and was assigned as a battery commander with the 152 Field Artillery. Following a second battery command and the completion of a number of staff assignments including a tour at the National Guard Bureau, Major General Tinkham commanded the Troop Command, Maine Army National Guard. A series of senior staff assignments followed culminating with service from 1994 to 1998 as the Maine Army National Guard Chief of Staff. Major General Tinkham has also served as the Deputy Commissioner of the Maine Department of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management and most recently as Executive Director, Maine Veterans' Homes.
