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3. Update from Maine EMS and OAG on Case 21-184

The Board issued an emergency suspension at their last meeting on July 7th, this went into effect on July 8th. A reinspection at the service was performed on July 12th following which, the service license was reinstated. AAG Guay reiterates that the emergency suspension does not take the place of the investigative process, that this process is ongoing, and a traditional investigative review is forthcoming. While 21-184 is docketed for an EMS Service, the investigation may result in additional dockets for individual licensees if evidence suggests further violations.

1. Proposed policy for standardized QA review/QA reviewer expectations or requirements as a part of a consent agreement or probationary condition.

At the June committee meeting discussion ensued about the QA proposal; specifically, apprehension about requiring a third-party reviewer who is not otherwise affiliated with the EMS agency, who would be allowed access to that agency's patient care reports. Jason Oko advised that it would be possible to restrict the third-party reviewer to patient care reports for the impacted licensee only. There was a larger discussion about the potential to use pre-qualified, state-contracted, QA reviewers. The item was tabled for old business at the July meeting.
