MOTION: The committee recommends resolving case 21-185 with a consent agreement for a probationary period, during which the license shall be restricted to the EMT level pending successful completion of a full (not a refresher) AHA ACLS, PALS and AMLS course; the licensee may perform up to the paramedic level during scheduled preceptorship response with a paramedic level provider, for which the licensee must document 25 emergency response calls; after successful completion of required training and preceptorship, the license shall be reinstated to the Paramedic level, and the licensee must coordinate a quality assurance review, by a qualified reviewer, for 100% of subsequent patient encounters for a minimum of 50 emergency calls.
