ME EMS Update	<p><u>Bradshaw</u>– Gave a Legislation update. Maine EMS will be monitoring LD 196 “An Act Regarding the Implementation of the Quality Assurance Program for Public Safety Answering Points”; this was tabled. LD 235 “ An Act to Improve Insurance Coverage for Volunteer Responders”; , this was tabled, LD 275 “Resolve, to Require the Emergency Services Communication Bureau to Expand the Existing quality Assurance System”;, this was tabled, and is the lead agency for LD 298 “An Act Regarding the Membership of the Emergency Medical Services Board.” This was passed to add a Fire Chief, and remove one of the public representatives, and LD 708 “An Act to Reduce Emergency Rescue Costs”, this will be set up as a pilot project, and LD 709 “An Act to Require Students to Receive Instruction in Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation”, this was not passed. Bill just introduced to increase reimbursement for ambulances from Maine Care.</p>	

	<p>Budget process has been through the initial hearing and several work sessions. All the departments were to report budgets back. The Appropriation Committee will start working on this.</p> <p>The EMS Memorial Bike Ride will officially be starting in Augusta this year. Jay, Matt Sholl, Tim Pieh, and Don Sheets plan to participate, and welcome any others that are interested.</p> <p>It was reported that the Bike Ride will correspond with the EMS Memorial unveiling, and with the EMS Awards on May 18, 2013 tentatively to begin at 9:00. Matt gave an overview of each of the days of the five day ride.</p>	
Community Para-medicine	<p><u>Bradshaw</u>, Steering committee have approved applications from Delta, United, North East Mobile Health, St. George, Crown, Calais. Other applications to be reviewed are NorthStar, CA Dean, Castine, and Millinocket.</p>	
IRB review for Southern Maine University	<p>Jay gave an overview of the purpose of the data collection to be able to link the patients from the crash to hospital to release. To look at the Maine EMS data 1.2 million records to improve the quality of the data. Could also look at not only crashes, but medical as well. This was preliminarily approved by the Board in April, 2013 and now is coming before the MDPB as it was postponed for the March meeting.</p> <p>Al Leighton gave a presentation on what they could do by examining our records for completeness and how to link all the data bases together. Before they could start this project had to get approval from Southern Maine University IRB committee. Introduced the team that would be working on the project to include himself, Rebecca Noreus, and Teresa Hubley. The approval from Maine EMS defines all the data sharing requirements that must be met.
