V. Staff Report:

- a. Board
 - i. Community Paramedicine Committee
 - (St. Germain) Maine EMS Board-approved committee that makes "recommendations" regarding education requirements & protocols
 - ii. Expectations and guidelines for Committees
 - (Russell) Goal is to move Maine CP forward in light of legislation becoming effective Nov. 1, 2017 with primary focus on developing criteria for services & providers to be eligible for the CP designation, the education requirements to do so, and determining how CP services will be reimbursed
- b. Legislative
 - (St. Germain) Legislation effective Nov. 1, 2017

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c. Maine EMS Rules

- (Kellner) Additional chapter being added to EMS Act by Rules Committee, "intentionally vague" and "sufficiently broad" so as not to preclude any potential services
- Purpose is to regulate, define & govern Community Paramedicine in Maine
- Will be voted on by Board in December or February

d. MEFIRS

- (St. Germain) ImageTrend offers CP reporting/data collection @ \$100K/year; Maine EMS and services may be able to develop "worksheet" pages in current system but with limitations
- Miles will research grant possibilities

a. Draft Maine EMS Rules

b. Workplan:

i. Community Paramedicine Designation

- 1. Service
 - (St. Germain) "Steering Committee" may or may not continue to
- approve new CP programs; possible this committee will take that over **2. Provider**
 - (Martin) Concerns were raised regarding the term "paramedicine" being used since not all CPs are actual Paramedics
 - Other options include "Primary Care" designation or the CPT/CPC designations
 - (Russell) EMTs & Paramedics are trained to do certain skills that they are not able to perform in Maine, asserts benefit of following a national curriculum even if certain CP programs/providers will not use all of the skills they are trained for
 - Currently there are no standards in Maine, with in-house training regimens ranging from 8-36hrs or 80-160hrs
 - (Kellner) MDPB has already defined scope of practice "ceiling," we need to determine the "floor"

ii. Community Paramedicine Educational Requirements

- (Russell), national standards being championed by Paramedic Foundation to include didactic & clinical training that would be "portable"
- (Kellner) leery of being "pigeon-holed by a commercial product" (i.e. HTC CPT/CPC curriculum)
- Lisa Larson, from EMCC, states need/ability/willingness to professionalize EMS through Community Colleges

iii. Community Paramedicine Reimbursement Research Report

- (Rolfe) "Education, Standardization, Compliance, Regulation, Oversight & Quality Monitoring" needed for State/Federal reimbursement
- (Taylor) Data collection/analysis should be among the top 3 issues that need to be addressed in order to be considered for reimbursement
- (Kellner) What would NEMSIS key data points be?
