i. Community Paramedicine Designation

- 1. Service
 - Not discussed
- Provider 2
 - (Russell) Proposed the following additional license levels to be considered by this committee:
 - PC-EMT
 - Primary Care Emergency Medical Technician
 - PC-AEMT
 - Primary Care Advanced EMT •
 - CPT (Paramedic)
 - **Community Paramedic Technician** •
 - CPC (Paramedic for a minimum of two years)
 - Community Paramedic Clinician
 - (Brouillard/Kellner) Expressed concern about volunteers being precluded if/when education/licensing standards are put into place due to cost/time constraints.
 - (St. Germain) Licensing standards require "Legislation," while education standards can be established through "Rules."
 - IBSC/BCCTPC is a nationally recognized organization that now certifies Community Paramedics (in addition to CCT & Flight Medics) 50% failure rate is likely due to lack of educational standards
- ii. Community Paramedicine Educational Requirements
 - (Russell) Proposed the following standards to include additional education in Primary Care, Prevention & Wellness, Public Health, Mental Health, Disease Management, Dental Health and Human Services:
 - Primary Care Technician (for EMT & AEMT)
 - 0 25-30 hours didactic & lab
 - 0 20 hours clinical
 - 6 hours CEH 0
 - **Community Paramedic Technician**
 - 45-50 hours didactic & lab 0
 - 40 hours clinical 0
 - 10 hours CEH
 - **Community Paramedic Clinician**
 - 14-16 college credit hours
 - 12 hours CEH
 - Requires 2+ years experience as a Paramedic 0
 - (Martin) Expressed concern that only 1 program currently established meets the proposed educational standards
 - (Russell) For reimbursement & professional recognition, future programs need to meet the national standard.
 - (Owen) Does reimbursement depend on a provider being certified by a national organization vs. licensed by a State?
 - As proven by Minnesota, no.
 - (Rolfe) Certain "community health" services will never be reimbursable.
 - (Kellner) This committee needs to establish the "ceiling" for the CP scope of practice & work downwards with requisite education standards based on established curricula.
